The presumed floor in the NW corner can be seen in a section at SE of platform where the wall must have lain over it. Is it illusory? There does seem to be a slight crust

7.45 work on [4] is nearly completed. It will be best to take some elevations

S of the doorway with the doorposts the soil is quite soft at the NE but extremely hard at the W . At the E there is a heavy admixture of chips. It seems best to go down below the level of the threshold to see what happens underneath.

The soil level is being brought reasonably even forwards the EW wall at the south - starting from a point approximately 2m from the NE pit of the trench (not the square) - clearing preparation for the topsoil - too much shadow present in the trench.

I intend then to remove the trench at the S of the trench including the small stream in the clearing - which has the appearance to be part of the Murre's bog - an narrowing of the stream there is much soil ground level.
