206/4 - Was started because we wished to excavate a roadway and also define the corner of one housing block being worked on. This site was chosen because it contained part of one modern track. Roadway found to be approximately 3m east of the modern track. A wall was found on the Eastern side of the trench that goes down to bedrock - probably the original occupation. There is also a wall on the western that seems to be of a later occupation as the stones are resting on soil. We have taken the roadway to be a cambered lens of soil that has a uniform composition. The pottery from this trench was mainly small non fragments that are consistent with a roadway.

207/4 - This trench was started because we were trying to find the south east west corner of the SE main house. A NS wall was found that seems to have been broken at the northern end. This room contained 2 ovens and a series of water pipes - which were further revealed when the bank was removed. We decided to excavate further to the north because a doorway seemed evident between the two rooms. (207/5)

207/5 - This trench was originally thought to contain a courtyard due to the level ground surface and its location - 1 room back from the roadway. This was working on the assumption that the room would open onto a central courtyard. Not much success as we excavated to bedrock without definitely finding a floor. We suspect the floor to be of a comparable height to the floor level in 207/4 - i.e just above the bedrock in the N of the trench.

207/5 cont - A substantial doorpost was found and one bank removed ~~the~~ to complete the excavation and reveal the doorway.

207/2 - opened because it appeared there was a doorway in the bank between 207/2 and 207/5 and we wanted to find the relationship. Further excavation of 207/5 showed there to be a continuous wall along the East bank thus no doorway possible. Excavated to bedrock with walls lining the East and South sides of the trench. No clear floor level found but the floor suspected of lying above the regolith in the North of the trench.

207/1 - Decided to excavate this trench to complete the square ad hoc and a relationship between these 4 rooms and the doorway evident in trench D7. Again we excavated to bedrock and didn't find a floor, although a very nice pottery layer which we think would probably have been just on top of a floor layer. A doorway was found in the NS wall which was filled in or possibly filled in because of tumble. This doorway was above the pottery layer and also above the GII layer, it was also higher than the doorway in D7 ⇒ perhaps different occupation levels.

To complete trenches we began removing banks in the last 5 days.

207/4-5

207/2-5

D7/207-1 - mainly done because a wall was suspected in the bank. The floor in D7 is a distinct compacted limestone which was not present in 207/1. assumed a wall. No wall was revealed when the floor level of D7 was reached.



- D8 - Hopefully this would give us the East-West wall of the house. Already the layer of D7 is large and no pillar bases have been found so a wall must be close.

General Desc: Work today is aimed at clearing tumble and revealing the strata at which excavation ceased last year. Most trenches have suffered partial collapse. At end '88, A3 was excavated to bedrock in N. corner & to an oven is S. end. At start '89 oven has been lost & excav. has continued to bedrock (B/R) ($\approx 40\text{ cm}$). Trenches D1, 4 & 7 had minimal tumble. An unstratified lamp fragment ^{89.026} was recovered from baulk being excav. between D1 & D4. Once cleaning-up of D1, 4 & 7 was complete (noon), it was decided to excavate baulk between D4 & 7 for a length of 2m to ascertain presence & a door or wall & also continuity of 'lane wall'. As excavation from D4 continued, it became apparent that there was a thin white (crushed limestone?) layer at a depth of ~ 70 cm at N end & 40 cm at S end. No such unit is visible from D7. although on top of the wall there appears to be a hard white layer. The bank wall & lane wall appear not to join ~ similar to a cross wall & lane wall in D1 (E side). 



which was considered too important to move. In the course of the past 12 months the door post has fallen into D6 hence there is no reason or impediment to the baulk's excavation. As the D4/D7 baulk is excavated to bedrock (for the southern 2 m) it will be possible to start on the D1/D4 baulk tomorrow morning.

Also discussed the positions of future trenches. Amanda & I anticipate working together on the next trench & possibly one each after that, if time permits. There are a few options, each influenced by longer term goals but short term gains. The general aim in the domestic sector is to excavate one entire block & adjacent streets. To this end, the C & D grids (each 15m x 15m) are good because they have started on the corner of one such block. That is the long term goal. The short term gains sort are maximum wall plans (external generally) & possibly a courtyard. Viewed with these constraints, 7 trenches seem most appropriate. See plan:

10.30 - Decision made to excavate to bedrock (through stratum 8). Will excavate to eastern (D4) edge of baulk line & 1m to west of D7 line. Have opened pottery & bone bags for stratum 8, Not a lot is being recovered however.

11.00 - Stratum 8 is only about 5-10 cm thick (varies over length & breadth of trench). The mud cement used in the construction of the wall is clearly different from the surrounding/burying soil. It is a much lighter, more yellow colour & is much more cohesive. The burying soil is quite friable & a medium rich brown colour. Another smaller, angular piece of bronze (heavily corroded) was uncovered near doorway).

12.00 - Discussion of future trenches & work with Peter C. The trenches D1, 4 & 7 have been excavated to the point where 3 internal walls are exposed where they terminate, adjacent to, but not in, the external wall. There are several options:

-1 excavate the baulks between the trenches thus fully revealing the walls within those squares,

-2 to only excavate the baulk between D1 & 4 thus revealing the relationship between two perpendicular walls,

Option two is ^{more} favoured because it gives definite information about two partially exposed walls. Peter is quite keen to see it done & I feel that it is useful. Should take 3-4 days. It wasn't done last year because of a large in situ doorpost ground & may reveal a courtyard.

General Desc:

0600 - Asked for the large door jam to be moved away from the baulk (D1 side) & Unis began to lever it over with a large pick. Before I could stop him, he had laid 3 blows onto it & broken off a large chunk. Completely cracked at $\frac{1}{3}$ line. Bloody vandal! Marked out the stratigraphy of the baulk & Peter C took 2 photos. Block moved to corner of trench, out of the way.

7:00 - Cleaning of corner before excavation of baulk D1/D4. As with D4/D7, we will take the topsoil & tumble layers out together. An interesting feature of the baulk is a 'fill' layer of cobbles about 50 cm deep.

8:00 - Excavation of stratum one continuing. Nearly a disaster when southern end of bank nearly collapsed. This would have meant the loss of our clearly defined stratigraphy. The year of weathering has made many bands distinctive.

8:30 - And the disaster has occurred. Have lost the best marker lines (on the southern end). Lost at least $\frac{1}{3}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the fall which is unfortunate because it contained a lot of large sherds. All material from the fall has been lumped together as 'Unstratified' 1-75.
