Baulks 1m. to N. & South between T11 & T13.


Location: Continuation of room to north of courtyard.

Obvious robber pit, loose stone on top & extremely uneven surface, down to floor level in S.E. corner.

Finds [1] Scattered pottery shards found in top soil larger blocks c. 4cm under surface particularly on Western side. Harder layer of broken stone & limestone underneath.

One badly weathered lump of basalt found.

*O.F.I. Two nails - one in S.W. corner, one in N.E. corner. Charcoal scattered throughout.



Locus [1] : Continued removal of topsoil, over square
Extremely disturbed surface - rubble fall + very loose sand. 1 nail found in middle of square. Few pieces of charcoal. Stone piled into N.E + N.W. corners In north-east area, plastic bag of bones (sheep knuckles (40); unbaked clay balls, net weight, plastic piece, 3 pottery sherds) found buried in loose topsoil fill. Probably from cobber, found c. 10cms ^{below} surface.





Locus [1] continued removal of topsoil, primarily along eastern side of square where greater depth of deposit. Removed (depth c10cms) = Pottery, charcoal + burnt sheep bones found. Covering E-W wall found continuous of wall from western square. Only ~~the~~^{N.} side of wall preserved higher than south but topped by degraded limestone blocks. Fall on both sides. In N.E. corner larger blocks tumbled probably from E-W wall in T-13. - clear line of fall down slope. In N.E. corner, Locus [3] degraded limestone gravel + fine sand removed continued to be removed. Just above very little large stone present. - some painted plaster fragments. In area of Locus [2] further knuckle bones, & marbles? found, above Locus [3] still surrounded by Locus [1]. On surface, at pit edge broken pilaster fragment? carved min. 2 sides.



(only small stones visible). Over thin ashy layer (not continuous) & what looks like packed mud.

Continued removal of locus 1 in eastern half of trench, especially North side of wall. ^{North of} middle of wall beside ^{to} small stone block, metal clamp (fragmentary) found.

In Locus 3 (Western side of trench) more painted plaster fragments found as well as tin foil? piece. Scattered bone fragments & charcoal in Locus 1.

Robber pit in S.W. corner, filled with extremely loose sand or rubble, edge clearly defined. Pottery collected in Locus 1 bog because disturbed.

E-W Wall - width c. 80 cms. - western side destroyed, at least in upper courses.

- Block #3 (see plan) rested upon 2 other carved blocks () and dense rubble underneath remains, probably pattern of fall from E-W wall in T.13, longitudinal direction of blocks. Block #2 socketed, although square block. (see p.4)

- #4: block with reef beam socket, fall after top of E-W wall already gone since almost on top of wall.



Locus [3] now over entire square: sandy soil, rubble & decayed limestone. Scattered signs of disturbance including animal bones, plant remains. Tiles fragments + Bronze pin found in Eastern side of square. North of E-W wall painted plaster fragment.

Further blocks moved from rubble fall in western corner

#5 : 70x24x63 - faced on at least 3 sides.

#6 : 19x23x29 - faced on 4 sides

In area of #6 large mass of decayed limestone. Tendency for larger blocks on top, beneath smaller blocks (weaker elements fell first?) - mixed in with gravel & rubble. E-W Wall topped on south side by decaying limestone blocks.

Locus [4] At depth of c 90cms from way area of packed mud (flooring?) up to E-W wall. C. 5cms above floor - metal bronze article found (Buckle?).

Locus [3] basalt block found (squared 170+ x 140+ x 40) in rubble near block 6.



Further clearing of Locus 4 - packed earth floor, but chopped about by rubble fall. Broken on western side. Ashy patch within it. Whorl? also found in level. Cleaned along western edge of floor & partly below it. = locus 6 on northern side. Large pottery fragments & bone against wall & beside edge of ~~the~~ floor (Locus 4) pottery base found plus charcoal (Locus 5). Clearing of area south of E-W. Wall - rubble & decayed limestone. Dense fall of stones apparently from E-W wall - some with mortar. No plaster found. Nail found between stone blocks, further nails found in W.

Clear direction of fall of rubble to south.
E-W Wall: broken. Formed of large regular blocks in lower course, slightly smaller but still regular blocks in second upper course. No evidence of plaster.
Soil in S.W. corner very disturbed, large stones & soft sand. Fragment of ~~socketed~~ stone found in pit ~~socketed~~ fortuitous hole for haulage?

Locus [5] (Locus [6]) Removal of dirt over second floor level (Locus [7]). Primarily sand & some rubble but small. Area of Locus [4] left in corner between baulks & wall.

Floor - width at N. baulk 230cm, at wall 70 cm. Bronze bracelet found in Locus [5], directly below floor, at western edge. Floor consists of 2 cms. of packed mud over crumbled limestone forming layer of 5 cm. (Total floor thickness - 7 cms). underneath & over 2nd floor sandy rubble. 1st Floor on eastern side (Locus [4]) broken by rubble not visible except in small area.

Area south of east-west wall cleared (Locus [3])

- rubble - large stones including some broken blocks over sand & decayed limestone. Pottery, tile fragments, bone found loose.

S. EW Corner - stone foundation for ~~wall~~ wall found but stone robbed out. On southern side of wall small area of floor. (Level directly above = Locus [8]) - broken about by robbers etc.

Locus [5] : underneath floor decorative plaster fragments found with rubble fill, demonstrating partial destruction of building before secondary use. - explains why floor not complete. One nail also found in this level.

Southern side of south-east-west wall

Consists of 3 courses extent only for 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ cms. from east baulk. Remainder of wall robbed out. Width of wall 58 cms. consisting of double row of stones, 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ cms each in width with c. 18 cms. of rubble packing between.

Limestone bedrock cut along line wall to provide platform 2 cms. high on south. No similar platform on north except in eastern section, possibly due to unevenness of bedrock.



Threshold size:- 75 E-W x 85 N-S.

T.16 - Summary

Southside of cistern the square contains one east-west double wall with existing 2 courses 715mm in width, in header stretcher construction. It's built directly on bedrock with no clearing or limestone debris from the rock, nor chinking of stone to form wall support. Plastered with rough plaster both on inside and outside. In order to make a stronger wall - there is alternation in the courses - the lowest course has slightly thinner stones on the northside, the next course on the southside.

On the north side there are 2 floor levels (**[6]** & **[5]**) both built of thick mud flooring, consisting on brown sand. The first floor level was 10 cms. above bedrock, then there is 15 cms between **[6]** & **[5]**. Above the second floor is a rubble layer with only small stones (Locus **[3]**) in which a column capital fragment was found.

Southside of the wall. The bedrock is quite uneven & has been leveled, fairly badly with brownish soil containing a small amount of gravel to form a thin uneven floor level (Locus **[4]**) containing some pottery. Above this is rubble (Locus **[2]**) containing some major architectural elements.

Very little evidence of occupation found - a distinct lack of pottery & only fairly coarse ware found, no bone, very little charcoal, very few small finds. Suggests a retaining wall south of the courtyard which was well floored & a walkway behind.
