





Not sure whether some people have been sent as substitutes.

7:00 Goudnah & someone else added to roll by Graeme. Work seems to have settled down a fraction.

7:10. Sarah excavated square(?) worked stone with worked centre. Stone measured 36x32x26. photographed.<sup>①</sup> Excavated.

7:30 Central jumble clearing. Key stone removed 28x35x25. dowel hole and chiselling hole noted. photographed.<sup>②</sup> Cornice with nail point excavated. photographed.<sup>③</sup>





7.15 String line cut to approx 20cm along length. Boys organized new wheelbarrow path. Gentian digging to get Ahmed onto the back. No finds as yet.

7.40 NE Quadrant almost excavated to 20cm spit. Small stones and rocks being cleared along east section wall.

8.00 Made up pottery & plaster bags.

8.15 Northern wall emerging - excavated by Hussein Nasa and Hadja Moona. Work along eastern progressing well. Hussein assisting Barry.

8.30 <sup>①+②</sup> boulders block with arrow cleaned and photographed <sup>and way</sup> between SE Quadrant & SW Quadrant. Abu Moona has begun to excavated possible conjunction of northern and eastern walls (ha'ard).

10.29. Work slowing down a fraction as sun is getting warmer. Hadyai Moorah working in central area of NW Quadrant at floor level together with Sabha. Another case of sickness this morning has left work with another small nephew who is shovelling for the NW Quad. Ah Moorah and Goudash excavating along inner wall. None remunerated with Sarah about the collapsed <sup>east</sup> section wall which was badly undercut. The wind is producing much dust in the trench and working conditions are made unpleasant. Pottery fragments in abundance are being recovered as well as a quantity of tile.

11.40 Hadyai Moorah working in NW Quad. excavated several pieces of mottled lead in a cluster at 3.29m from West Section & 3.07m from North Section. A broken pottery sherd was found adjacent
