
10 - 9 - 91

6-30 am - The weather is clear, cool with no wind.  
We begin to clear surface debris from new  
trench - T23

8-00 am - First 5-15 cm have been removed.  
So far there has only been one sherd found -  
basically only dirt. A few worked building  
blocks are beginning to appear. However, they  
look as if they have only fallen down. No  
definite architectural features so far.

We seem to have 14 workers - details later -  
I think we still have a few tassers on.

8-20 - First find! In the S-E corner of  
the trench (see sketch below) we found  
a piece of architrave with a lion's head  
spout & guttai (hopefully) up the top



portion of architrave



8-30 am - small triangular shard, 2-3 cm each side, found. Very, very faint (scratched in?) decoration (nothing much)

11-30 am - still scraping away first level of brown soil - no sherd at all - architectural features so far - only rubble. Trench is presently 10-30 cm deep. Part of a column drum has (possibly) been found.

12-30 - cleaned rocks + trench - GWC took photos of the lions head spout.



We've found a few more sherd - but nothing haven't be patterned. A couple of other pieces to bone have also been

6.15 start - weather - fine clear with a slight wind.

Begin Loculus II - just below top soil!  
Gather a few sherds into one bag. Locate wall of Acropolis following on from neighbouring trench - in SW side - wall follows along western side of aero trench.

Begin to remove large broken blocks. The first removed was approx. 50cm x 30 x 25 - very badly damaged.

7.30 - coin found in SW corner of trench.

8.00 - large piece of masonry removed from middle of eastern side of trench - approx 70 x 60 x 30 cm.

9.45 - Remove <sup>piece of masonry</sup> rock from SW corner of trench  
GWC suggested that it may have been part of a column - however, when it was lifted out of the trench one side was clearly flat & plastered - so perhaps it was just part of the wall.

We've found a few more sherds - but nothing coherent or patterned. A couple of small pieces of bone have also been

The trench is presently about 30 - 40 cm deep.

GWC consulted, thinks that piece just removed might have been part of a door due to slight wedge shape.

Floor level hit on east side 10-00 am approx 40-50cm deep.

In S-W corner an architrave has been found & guttae clearly discernable. It may be that a lion water spout ~~will~~ be found on the other side. - details later.

GWC instructed workers to level off the trench & carefully scrape away at the floor. Primary concern now is to locate stylobate - hopefully slightly off centre towards S-E corner. Details later.

B Part of a Sangle also found & placed in 'objects' bag.

10-00 am

Block on Western side removed 55x47x35 cm.

Still looking for stylobate - floor level appears to be rather dodgy at the moment - very uneven.

GWC consulted again as to floor level - agreed it was difficult to determine & rather uneven.

Weather at 11-00 is heating up - quite a good S/W wind - lots of dust!!

Piece of masonry removed from N side of trench  $80 \times 55 \times 32$  approx.

12-00 pm - consultations with Barry suggest that the floor could be another 30cm or so further down (tomorrow's project) - still no sign of stylobate.

For the rest hour will work on leveling off the trench

Day Three

6-15 - start - Weather is fine & cool. There is quite a lot of haze around, possibly from Kuwait & the wind, coming from the SW is quite strong. Looks like it will be very dusty today.

To begin with I asked the workers to dig the trench about 10cm deeper all over + to continue to remove tumbled masonry. The plan today is to reach the trench floor + find the stylobate.

6-30 am - we appear to have hit the floor of the trench after excavating only another 7cm approx. No sign of stylobate in hoped for spot.

Any objects found in the majority of the trench today will be labelled Loculus III.

In the NW corner of the trench, however, we have gone down a little further. As there seems to have been a hole in the floor for a large amphora. Shards have been found in this corner + will be labelled Loculus IV.

7-00 am - removed the second piece of architrace, that we found yesterday.

9-30 am - continue slowly excavating trench  
floor. Earher announcement regarding finding  
the floor now seems to have been a false  
alarm. After discussions with GWC it seems  
floor may still be a little further down.  
It's very difficult to tell as it seems  
that before the building fell collapsed  
wash built up + hardened each year  
leaving the appearance of a floor at  
several points.

Still no sign of stylobate.

10-30 am - success! Stylobate located  
on eastern side of trench. A few nice  
pieces of stone 10cm + 15cm approx also  
located on western side of trench.



It appears that the trench will divide into 2 rooms with a wall running from E -> W on the northern side of the trench. Several pieces of red coloured plaster turning up - probably from the wall which is appearing.

also finding a few worked pieces of pottery - rims etc - nothing stamped or glazed though

Will hopefully have finished Loculus I - removing the top soil by 1-00 pm.

Have also cleared up quite a lot of fragments for in the other end of the trench. (See photographs) They could possibly be floor or hand animal ash they are only about 5cm deep



as they are only about 30cm below







First piece out was the aforementioned piece of cornice.






They may be tumbled or possibly a late alteration to a doorway - details later.

12.39 - Great find! Metallic bangle - copper? (has gone green)







We started by asking the workers to level off the trench.


Most finds will be labelled Lockhart.



There is a great deal of ash around the additional walls suggesting - according to GWC, that the floors may have been dug into by later occupants who then built fires - so we may never find a definite floor level, particularly in the following spots:-




Trench Twenty Three ground level.


