Large pitthos oven still being excavated centre trench producing glass frags. [T65F3] metal frags [T65F4], large nail [T65F5] and many other nails (or nail fragments). The ash soil deposit below the pitthos is becoming darker + most of the nails found are lye (suggesting the burning of timber members of the building ∴ possible secondary occupation).

Seems to be no formal layout of stones in trench ∴ they will be removed. Plaster covered square block (x2) have appeared against the W wall - one is = block in adjacent T62 and equidistant from centre column (circular plastered). Large block (90x25x15) removed from trench N/W corner. Larger block 110x35x35 removed from base of . Centre trench adjacent to N bank [T65F6] - metal fragment (circular) excavated from oven area centre trench.

This is 3rd day that large deposits of pitthos tanov have appeared - suggest possible whole pitthos.

* [T65F7] - Coin excavated in area of timber.

[T65F8] - Metal Pin (flat) excavated adjacent to SE corner. More glass appearing and bagged with [T65F3]. The ash deposit appears to occupy a significant section of the floor? (2 1/2 metre diameter circle)

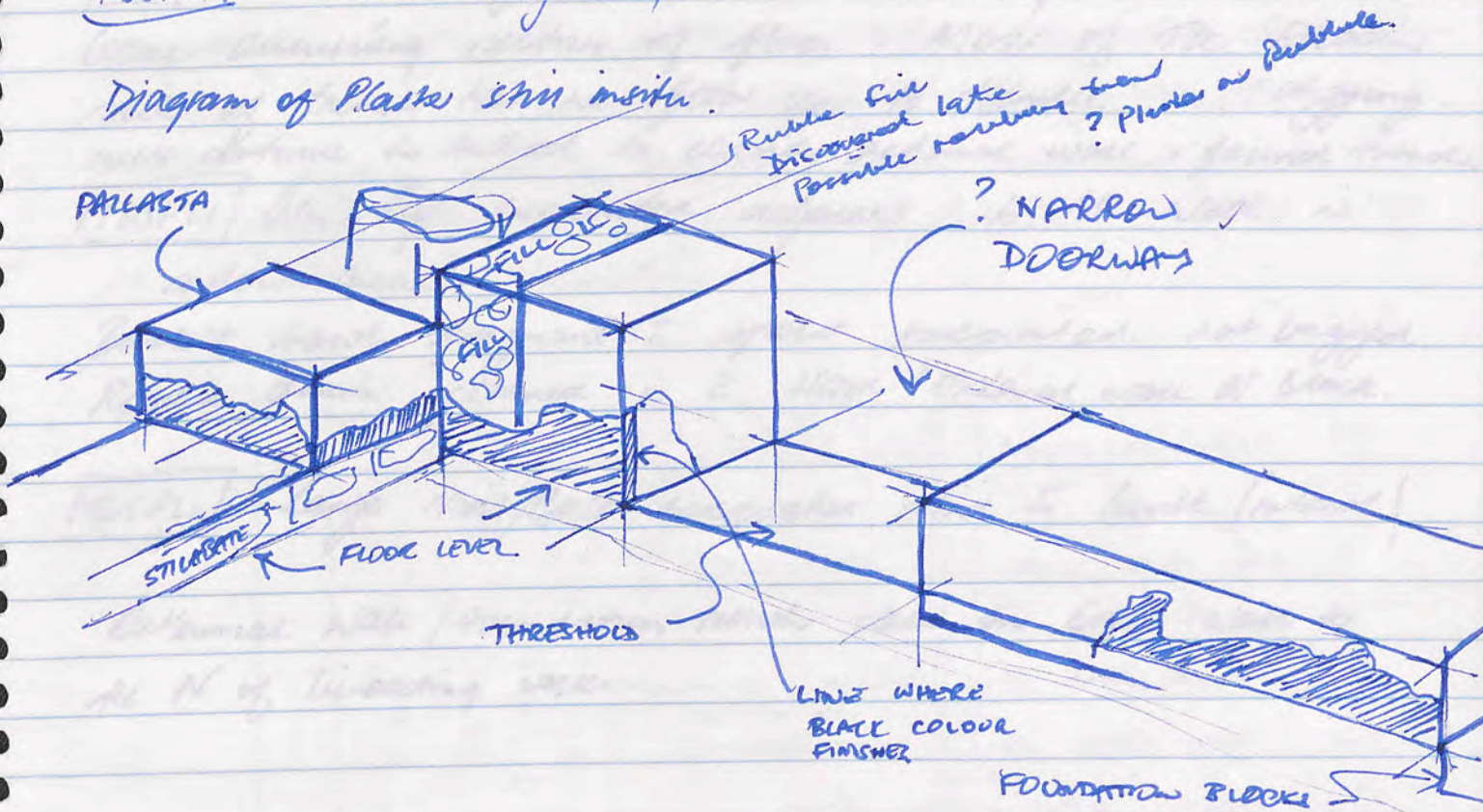

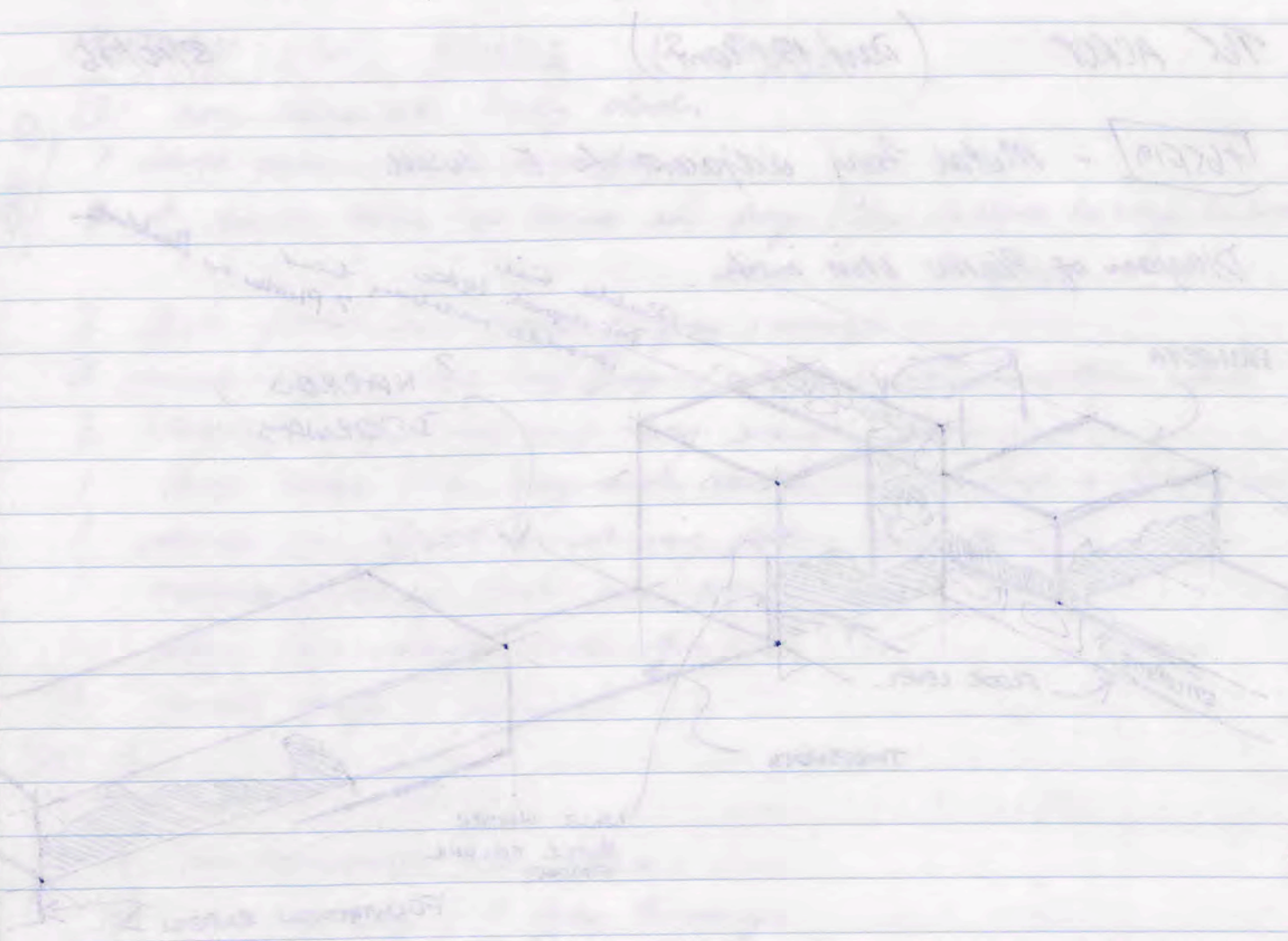

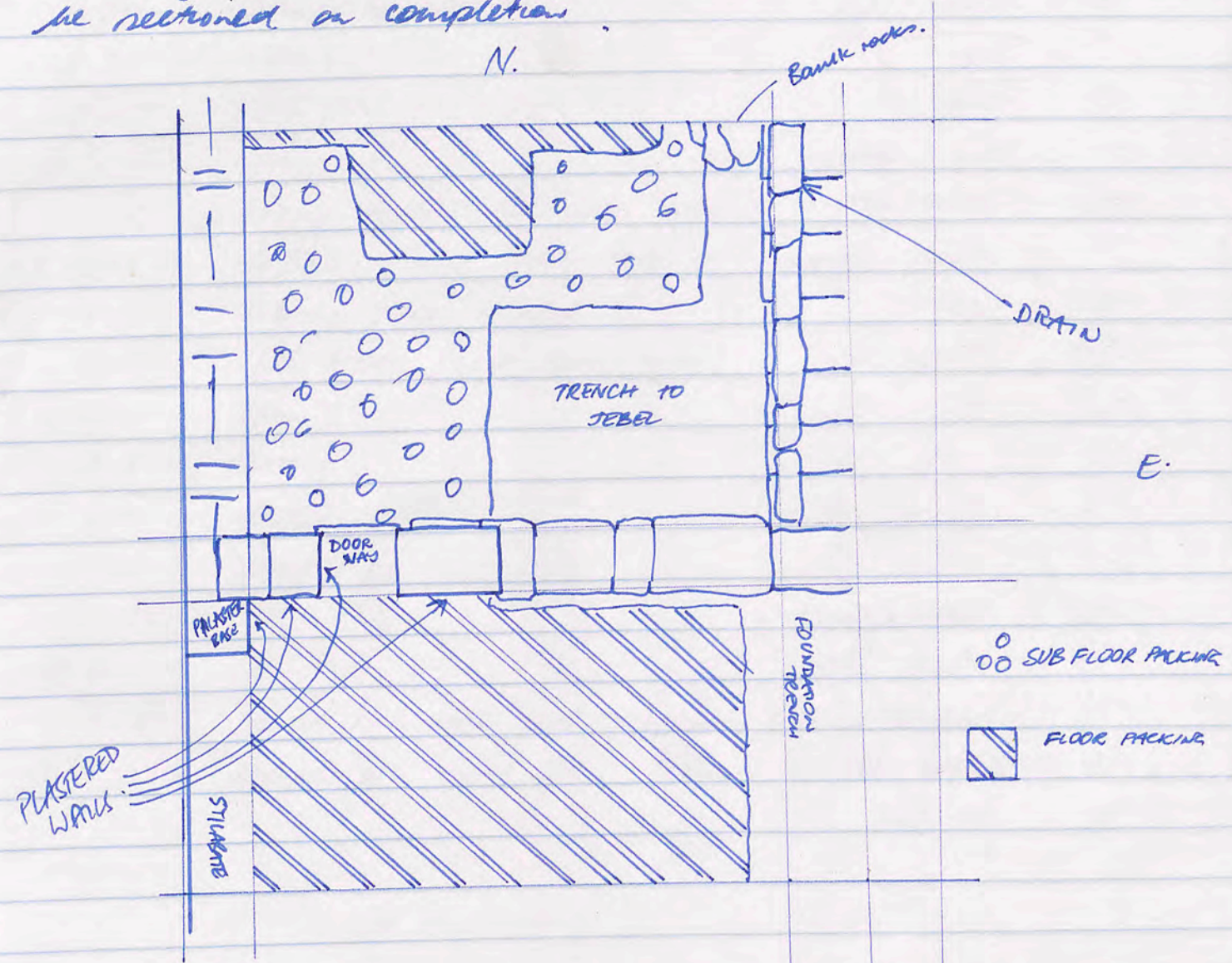

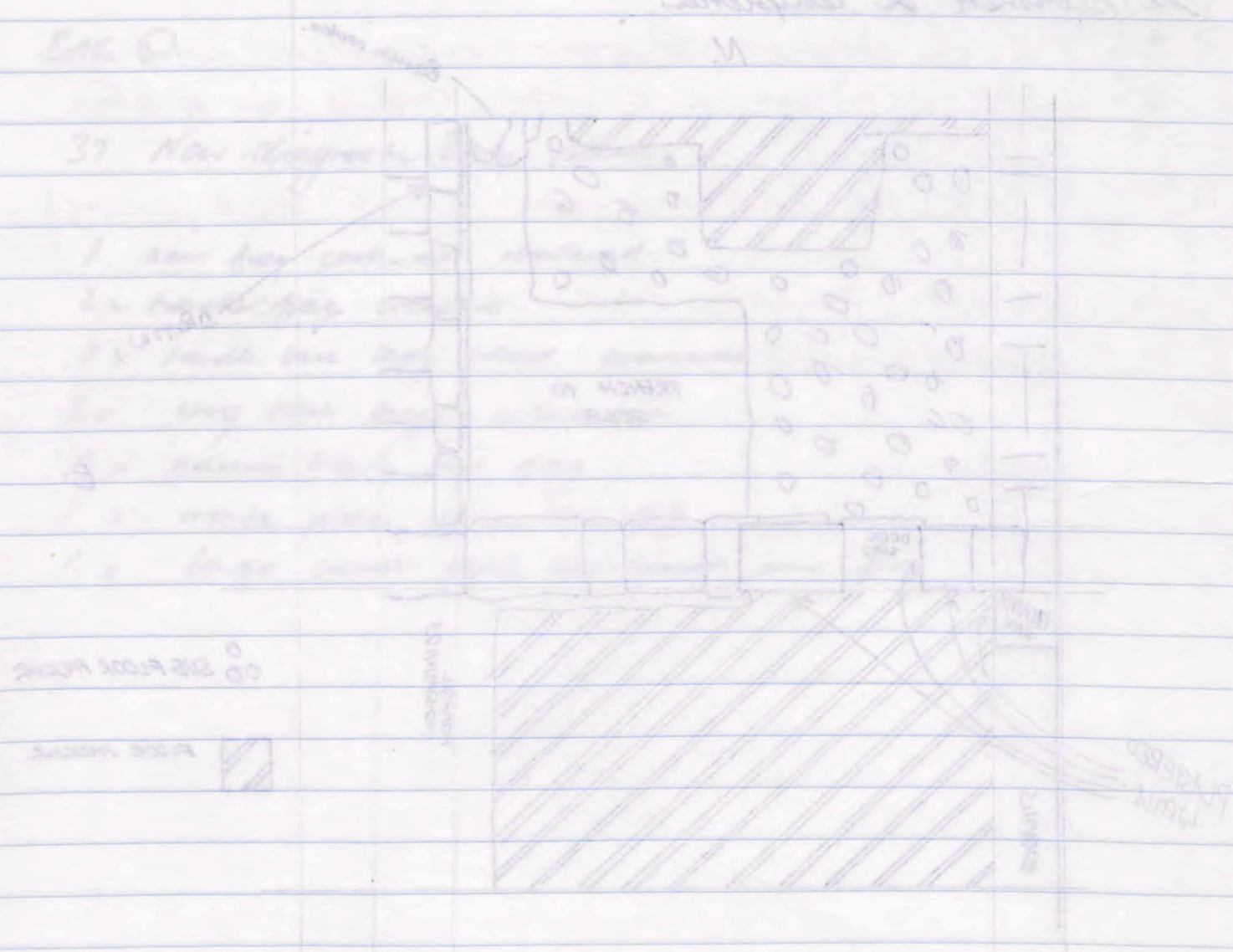
