We will start by cutting out the surface layer in the trench, but I don't expect much here. The ground surface is fairly hard, there are some loose stones close to the wall. Today temperatures are still warm. There is very little in the way of alluvium, nothing is not much above bedrock and we have almost nothing.

We continue to clear surface soil. We will focus on with a further amount of trench, including debris covered surface picked up from the floor. We are quickly clearing the floor about at the level of the bedrock surface, which are varying closely to the surface. The depth is c. 30cm of soft, broken stone. There is very little in the way of articulated material. We will clear the topsoil of the wall & continue on clearing the floor. A red fragment is the only object we find in the characteristic white soil. Moving on the floor disappears. Next on the left, moving to the left along a small bag of charcoal.

We are clearing in the eastern area of the trench, surface to often 30cm will be later BC, which I fully expect to be similar to yesterday's exposure, a little surface humus, a thin layer of wind-blown desert soil. A strange white soil layer appears


at the floor with charred + bone, remains of the base of what T 58 is a part. It is also covered with a large pile of white frags are in the fill. A layer of sand is found over the western end of the trench on the floor, a large red sand tabby. A pile of coarse debris is upon this with broken soil.

15/9/96

We will clear the surface stones under very trying first day conditions and get the trench clear for proper excavation. Meantime everyone is clearing stones for Ed's trench T61 until early morning break. We expect to pick up the exterior wall of the house on the East side but I don't expect much else. The floor will be partly there and partly lost closer to the wall. Take PUMP to-morrow for wheelbarrow. There is very little in the way of abraded pottery & not much else beside hardened wind-blown dust.




16. 9. 96.

We continue to clear surface soil so still locus Δ with a fair amount of tumble including abraded worked stones picked for plaster to adhere. We are quickly finding the floor almost at the level of the surviving wall stones which are emerging clearly. At the western end the depth is c. 85cm. of fill, broken stones. There is very little in the way of artefactual material. We will clear the definition of the wall & concentrate on clearing the floor. A nail fragment is the only object so far in the characteristic sterile fill. Near the wall the floor disappears. Nail is Δ ①, Pottery Δ ②. And a small bag of charcoal.

17. 9. 96

We are clearing in the western area of the trench, surface to floor, which will be locus Δ , & which I fully expect to be similar to Δ ③.  Yesterday's experience, a little surface tumble & after that wind-blown sterile soil. A storage vessel hole has emerged in the floor with charcoal & bone, consistent with the kitchen use of the room of which T58 is a part. It is clear that the storage hole held a large pithos of which frags are in the fill. A lamp nozzle is Δ ① found near the western end of the trench on the floor. Δ ② a large nail found similarly. A piece of worked basalt is again consistent with kitchen use.



We have reached the W end of the trench, revealing where Julia cut out the tandoor. We shall continue clearing towards the S. This is all locus 3, the same fill over the floor which is the standard beaten dirt. Another nail frag. in the S end. A broken stone 35 cm deep 64 max length 56 width (complete).

18. 9. 96

I continue to clear the remainder of the western end of the trench and then we shall tidy up the whole trench to get a clear definition of the walls of this food preparation room. It should be finished by the end of the morning. The eastern + northern walls show the picking for plaster. A stone has been removed, with a clear width of 55 cm, otherwise broken (41 cm.) but 32 cm. deep D.K. also, another 55 x 29 x 109 cm long, picked for plaster, but also abraded, removed.

The floor is hard-packed limestone / mud with a clear light layer of brown dust just above it.



Started clearance of deposit from excavation on trench adjacent to T59. Great deal of recent spoil & then the Tadel quickly drops away. With high wind we are merely clearing the surface of rocks + soil deposited

19.9.96

We will clear away more of the deposit of spoil, not taking any sherds as they are from disturbed contexts. We hope the wall will emerge on the western side of the trench, which it is on the S end by 8.30 a.m. Apart from clearing the major part of the deposit, there's v. little to report of interest.

21.9.96

Continuing to clear amongst the debris of robbing as well as of digging deposit. There is little to report but the emergence in the SW corner of the trench of plaster (red, duck-egg blue) and a piece of column fluting from a large column. We can't see the wall so far beyond the first course. A metal slab will be \triangle (1). There is still some plaster adhering to the E side of a wall block. This will be cleared later. There is plaster of green, red, black coming up in quantity with bevelled edges and top ridges. I will take back a 3ambrel full for analysis.

22.9.96

We're clearing the robber spoil with shovel + pick. A metal clamp is \triangle (1) with a nail. There are no features emerging as yet. A small frag. of column fluting in the spoil heap, and some more plaster in the SW corner near the wall (back-wall of colonnade). There is one small bag of pottery \triangle (3), + a coin, a surface find somewhere on the acropolis \triangle (3), a clear Roman coin. = 96.048 Valentinian I:4

23. 9. 96.



It looks like a wall is emerging E/W in the robbed-out area; at least the foundations of it. The floor has been reached in the S part of the trench, with a very ashy level over hard packed rubble layer, here there is considerable rubbish pottery + charcoal = locus (2)



(2) (1) is a large nail from the same locus on the floor. Loose frags. of plaster from ceiling dado have come up, labelled in a Zanzibar as (2) (2). Two bags of pottery (many with pitched interior) coming thickly on the surviving floor = (2) (3), with a frag. of charcoal.

We continue clearing on the SW wall area to get definition. The rest of the trench so far is just spoil with the 'western' wall of the colonnade still uncertain (i.e. in the trench). 67 (broken) x 55 (O.K.) x 23 (O.K.) stone removed, otherwise it is disturbed spoil as the result of robbing, so we continue to go down. A frag. of ?bronze rim is (3) (1) fn to-day, (3) (2), metal clamping pieces found on the floor in the SW corner. First bag of pottery, by 8.40 a.m.!, is (3) (3). Small coin (3) (4) = 96.105. Ant.iii

25. 9. 96

We'll keep going down — there's no other option. The floor exists only in the SW section of the trench, otherwise it has been completely robbed, so far as we can see. The block with plaster adhering looks like it is out of place — so far. There is a distinct brown level above the stoney level which I presume is packing for the lost floor. But it is poorly defined + abraded + not worth following. A nail is (4) (1), (4) (3) is a glass frag. but all we basically have is disturbed spoil, proven beyond doubt by encountering a plastic bag 1.5m. below surface! Pottery for the day is (4) (3)

26.9.96.

A bag of plaster fragments will be $\triangle 5$ ①. These have been gathered loose in the fill. We are progressing towards the N. end of the trench & will then have to go down to bed-rock for any definition. It looks like we will find the foundation trench only in the NE corner, but a series of rooms on the E front now seems certain, with only, perhaps, a small entry into the courtyard. A glass frag. is $\triangle 5$ ②, a handle frag. of bright green glass is $\triangle 5$ ③.


We simply continue to clear to bedrock through the brown rubbly soil that was undoubtedly the underfloor packing of the original floor now irretrievably lost through robbing. There is some plaster coming up (in solid colours) and a little pottery. As we clear to jebel this is locus ⑥.

On the NS wall in the N corner of the trench a column drum, in situ, c. 67 cm. in diameter, still plastered!!! Pottery is $\triangle 6$ ①

A whole nail near the column base is $\triangle 7$ ①. We simply continue for the day clearing to bedrock - hopefully the last day of it. There is now the clear lines emerging in the bedrock of a. EW wall. And a further plaster frag.







It is clear the stones revealed are foundation blocks, -+ not necessarily in true alignment, for an enclosure wall.


