ADVICE to TRENCH SUPERVISORS

1. Take a **new page** for each day. (Each day may take several pages).
2. Draw a **scale plan** of the trench **each day** on the graph paper (essential), with North at the top (if this is not convenient, mark North direction clearly).
Mark depth from surface at the beginning of each day, at designated points.
When starting a square, this plan may be nearly empty but draw it all the same and mark in emerging tumble.
3. Draw arrows on your plan to indicate **direction** in which you are excavating.
4. Every time you designate a new context, (on the occasion of a new spit, a new feature, a new soil colour) fill in the **Context Record Sheet** for that trench, as well as describing it in your report. Store the accumulated context record sheets in the plastic sleeve in your record book.
5. **Structures** . Measure carefully any structure (wall, doorway, threshold, ovens, pit, any large dressed stones or columns) and record exact location, height, width in your report as well as on the scale plan.
6. **Floors** - marked by very hard tough surface or layer of white crushed limestone. May be softer adjacent to wall. Record thickness of floor, if we decide to dig through it.
If your floor is particularly good, collect a few bags of surface material - there may be seeds.
7. **Objects**. e.g. glass, figurine or lamp fragments, metal, stucco, loomweights, spindle whorls, beads, graffiti-ed sherds, coins, gold jewellery (some hope). Mark in the location and depth of any objects clearly and accurately. If necessary, draw another sketch plan as the day progresses. A quick sketch of the object in the report would be helpful, if it is too mysterious to name e.g. Mattie's metal blobs.
8. **Pottery:** label bags clearly in waterproof pen, with one label inside the bag and one outside. **Record daily the number of bags per context** . Be very careful to separate pottery from different contexts.
It is absolutely essential to double-bag the pottery. A broken bag of pottery without context is useless.
9. **Bone:** Collect all bone and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
10. **Charcoal:** Collect all charcoal and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
11. **Tile:** it is important to record the location and amount of tile.
12. **Very important:** at the completion of a trench, draw to scale:
 - i Draw a section of the exposed baulk, with details of stratigraphy clearly marked.
 - ii Draw a top plan of the completed trench, with contexts clearly marked.
 - iii Write a short summary with your interpretation of the trench.





- 1/5 - Starting at about 80 cm down, over about 1m².
- The north-south "rock wall" is becoming clearer, but may just be a pile of rocks. We are digging around it to check the bottom.
- Lots of rock tiles, some quite large, ~~almost~~ almost all with one side white, probably limestone deposit (anc).
- Several large pieces of limestone blocks: 45cm 30cm, 20cm x 2 removed from the northwest corner.
- #1; a nail.
- *: a piece of plastic (see map): disturbed context!
(about 1m down).
- 1/6. - cleared around "rock wall" to 95 cm from top
- nothing of interest, down to 110 cm from top
- 1/7 - lots of large rocky/broken blocks: 50cm, 40cm, 30cm, etc... in northwest corner.
- some limestone deposits + completely broken down limestone blocks.
- #2: a coin, found in sand in northeast corner.
- down to 130 cm from top. Located what looks like floor blocks (limestone, falls apart, not to the rock wall)



- We are removing the loose wall that ran N/S ~ 2m from the West edge. N↑ [T22] It had a couple of large squared-off blocks (~50cm) with no particular markings. The rest is smaller stones <20-30cm and very loose fill. There have been a few pieces of roof tile and very little pottery shards. The fill dirt is varied: some clay, different colours, plus a few small shells.
 - N [Tac] Nail found in the middle of the wall ~1.1m down labelled object #1 locus 1 spit 9.
 - It is clear that there was a reasonably recent grass layer in the North face, level with the grass on the west wall (N.1L end).
 - A quite large worked stone 50-60 has come out of the base of the wall.
 - A small round piece of iron found N↑ [T15] (exc: boss from shield)? object #2.
 - A nail found nearby object #3 [P] at both H2-H3 of base of wall
 - Have emptied the first zambel of roof tile. One of the curved pieces is an interesting brick red colour (all the way through)
 - A rock carved into some toes appeared N↑ [T22] 1.2m down. Another worked rock is at the same place but doesn't look like anything in particular.
 - Toes is object #4, other worked stone #5



Given where the paving stone has been found (slightly further along the West side), the brown layer is possibly dirt on the paving stone face. Then more limestone blocks fell on the dirt. The limestone layer under the brown layer is very fine. Some of the limestone pieces above the brown layer are big but very crumbly



We have cleared it down to a crumbled limestone layer that is approximately even with the NW corner. The limestone layer is a bit lower than the paving stone level. (also very loose)
 - We are now removing the other stone wall. It is 1.7 m high.
 - A small piece of charcoal was found in the wall.
 - We have cleared to a level just under the paving stone.



- Today we will clear to the top of the third level of paving stone #1 (located to the East of the other paving stones. The paving stone (level) in Ed's trench (to the North) is much lower than the one we're just uncovering. It looks like there was at least 5 levels of paving stone here.)
 - The stone coming up is broken limestone. The pieces are quite sharp. Perhaps they were broken when the paving stones were lifted.
 - An interesting stone has come up [42] [0.3] It is hollowed out and has a hole at one end. It might be some sort of alter piece to hold a small sacrifice? with a drainage hole?? GWC thinks it might be a metal working crucible. They found something similar last year but smaller. The stone is object #1. It was reasonably near the surface ~50cm (?)
 - Some charcoal was found at the South end of the working area (marked on plan).
 - A coin was found at [F x 30.3] [2.15] the end of the paving stones (there is another layer of paving stone underneath - object #2)
 - Another coin found nearly at same level - object #3 coin (?)
 - A nail was found - object #4 at the SE corner of the worked area

- The ladies digging eastward south of the paving stones seem to be getting deeper every day. They are now about (level) with the end of the paving stones and are perhaps 20m below the base of the third level of paving stones. A fourth level is clearly visible.
- A broken paving stone has come up about (level) with the end of the paving stones and 1.3m SADL.



- A broken river stone has come up, approximately (level) with the base of third layer of paving stones. It was probably a good size to use as a pounding stone. The front shows some chipping that supports this idea. Groene suggested that it was used to grind incense.
- We are also seeing some grass + roots. Same level as river stone, unsure how deep from surface as the side of the ~~the~~ short bank was quite deep around here.



 - Debel has found some bone ~2m east of the paving stones.
 - A small stone tool, possibly made from a river stone has come up
 - A small piece of glass was found on the ground next to our trench - object #1
 - Another large piece of paving stone was found next to the previous one - it is a similar size. Underneath (or next to) these broken paving stones was a piece of black plastic with some regular punched holes!
 - A piece of green marble was found ~10m East of the SE corner of our trench. It is apparently similar to a worked piece that was found earlier - object #2.
 - Anoona has found some charcoal and a small marble disc - object #3 - along the North edge (2m from east edge, 60cm from wall edge). She has also found the edge of some blocks that seem to be the same (one) as paving level 4.
 - Tukuija found the base of a PET bottle (soft drink bottle) ~1.6m south of the paving stones, in line with the end of the third level.
 - We have found (and emptied) one good-sized zanbeet of roof tile and have a good-sized bag of pottery too.

The ladies have continued to dig deeper (despite my preference that they stay at the base of the third level), they have revealed another layer of housing zone (the fifth) extending out to the east of the fourth layer. They are now working to reveal the extent of the fourth layer to the North and West. Then they will need to return to the South edge to bring that down to the same level. The original gully bank was located in the NW corner sloping down to the East side (but not all the way to the South side). There is a gully running ~ 1.5m parallel to the South edge of the trench. Graeme believes this might be the line of the external wall. It is the south side of this gully - the slopes back up - that will need to be dug to finish this level. Some charcoal was found just east of the NS line of the fourth level of housing (in line with the north edge of the first 3 levels of housing). We are seeing some thickish roots (plant not grass) on top of the fourth level of base. The East face of the corner block of the fourth level seems to


be rusticated. The trench to the North (Ed's) has rusticated blocks in line with ours. Ed then has two sets of two blocks placed perpendicular to the rusticated face (but not quite in contact). They would look like tumbles except that they are so regular.

It looks like we may have the same structure with that fifth level of hairy stone. This is because there seems to be a gap between it and the musicalized face of the fourth level and because the top of this fifth level seems to be higher than the bottom of the fourth level.

Ed's theory is that the rusticated face is the east edge of the foundations. The perpendicular stones are to compartmentalise the fill that would have been the foundation of the non-structural (not supporting columns) floor of the temple.

Following this line of logic we would not expect to find the fault line to continue into the NW corner of the trench. The area would have not been weight bearing and would not have need the support of solid stone or bedrock, hard packed fill would have been adequate. We shall see, more stones means less digging though so I would be happy to be wrong.

 - Reached jbel in all but the northwest corner of the bous ; bout 90cm down from eastern buttress. In the northwest corner (against the foundation wall) and underneath the south-west fill (opposite end block) there is a hole what appears to be a (natural?) hole in the jbel, which extends down another 50 cm or so. The fill in the hole contains several large rocks and some larger bone pieces.
 - Finished the bous (and the trench). Today just small bags of pottery, bone & charcoal. The bottom of the hole is 143 cm below the top-most southern exterior blocks in the north-side foundation wall.




Final Summary report:
The main finds of this trench were the foundation walls running East-West + North-South, and the associated fill compartments East of the North-South wall. It seems likely that the fill in the fill compartments + in the northern corner below the level of the walls was undisturbed from the original building, but this should be confirmed with my database finds (such as coins + pottery). The other also found was a rock retaining wall running East-West, a couple of metres South of the East-West foundation wall. The area between the retaining wall and the foundation wall had been extensively recently disturbed (evidenced by plastic bags + a boot heel found ~~at~~ reasonably close to bedrock). A feature of the area is the number of disturbances, clearly ranging from Roman (cooking pots + other pottery), Byzantine (soil) + recent (plastic).
