


#### ADVICE to TRENCH SUPERVISORS

1. Take a new page for each day. (Each day may take several pages).
2. Draw a scale plan of the trench **each day** on the graph paper (essential), with North at the top (if this is not convenient, mark North direction clearly).  
Mark depth from surface at the beginning of each day, at designated points.  
When starting a square, this plan may be nearly empty but draw it all the same and mark in emerging tumble.
3. Draw arrows on your plan to indicate **direction** in which you are excavating.
4. Every time you designate a new context, (on the occasion of a new spit, a new feature, a new soil colour) fill in the **Context Record Sheet** for that trench, as well as describing it in your report. Store the accumulated context record sheets in the plastic sleeve in your record book.
5. **Structures** . Measure carefully any structure (wall, doorway, threshold, ovens, pit, any large dressed stones or columns) and record exact location, height, width in your report as well as on the scale plan.
6. **Floors** - marked by very hard tough surface or layer of white crushed limestone. May be softer adjacent to wall. Record thickness of floor, if we decide to dig through it.  
If your floor is particularly good, collect a few bags of surface material - there may be seeds.
7. **Objects**. e.g. glass, figurine or lamp fragments, metal, stucco, loomweights, spindle whorls, beads, graffito-ed sherds, coins, gold jewellery ( some hope). Mark in the location and depth of any objects clearly and accurately. If necessary, draw another sketch plan as the day progresses. A quick sketch of the object in the report would be helpful, if it is too mysterious to name e.g. Mattie's metal blobs.
8. **Pottery:** label bags clearly in waterproof pen, with one label inside the bag and one outside. **Record daily the number of bags per context** . Be very careful to separate pottery from different contexts.  
**It is absolutely essential to double-bag the pottery. A broken bag of pottery without context is useless.**
9. **Bone:** Collect all bone and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
10. **Charcoal:** Collect all charcoal and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
11. **Tile:** it is important to record the location and amount of tile.
12. **Very important:** at the completion of a trench, draw to scale:
  - i Draw a section of the exposed baulk, with details of stratigraphy clearly marked.
  - ii Draw a top plan of the completed trench, with contexts clearly marked.
  - iii Write a short summary with your interpretation of the trench.



- 1/1 - Spit 1 starts at the top of the pile, approximately in the middle of the North side
- Found metal or stone tube from long 15cm diameter N/P  $\frac{2.5m}{x}$  P.S.M. Maybe 15cm below surface object 1
- There is a large worn stone (approx 15cm x 15cm x 3cm) on the surface (slightly buried) N/P  $\frac{0.2m}{\square}$  the edge is 5cm from the string.
- When we get to it we take it down and I'll draw it. Groome thinks it might be a roofing stone.
- Found small piece of marble 8cm x 5cm x 3cm N/P  $\frac{1.6m}{x}$   $\frac{2.6m}{\square}$  object 2 found ~15cm below surface
- Another piece of marble, probably on or near the surface N/P  $\frac{x 10cm}{\square}$  object 3 8cm x 3cm x 1cm
- Put all the pottery from locus 1 spit into bag labelled pottery locus 1 spit 1 bag 1
- All the roof tile found today came to one heap/rammed some of the pieces were quite large
- One largish river stone was found near the top
- Probably take off top 20-30cm, one area 60-70cm.


- L1/1 Progressing eastward - much tumulus along North side of trench coming up. Molded stone lifted from mid point or northern border adjacent to large worked stone [A] (about to be photographed) when cleaned up.  
 Byz. Coin (1.1.1) Lamp frag (1.1.2) + 1.1.3 all lifted just beneath top soil layer (grassy section).  
 Piece of basalt (grinding stone) lifted from same zone. Much red tile evident - not bagged.  
 Plan: Remove remainder of top soil.  
 - commence new spit approx 300mm deep to reveal worked stones that are just getting through the surface.  
 Burnt piece of bone from surface (context unknown) - bagged anyway.  
 Very little pottery.  
 L1/2 Commenced new spit from west border of trench just above level of pavements.

L2/1	Have completed this bank to the excavated level of L1/2. A very distinct zone of limestone concentrated soil remains. The large stones are irregular & don't form any structure - clearly this area is very disturbed. Plan to commence new banks 3 & slice down spit by spit.
L3/1	Immediately, more pottery coming up in the brown earth well to the pavors to the west of the trench. A paving stone has appeared in the NW quadrant & the possible column drum [D] appears probable. There is a possibility that another pavor lies to the north of the 1st. Another column drum has appeared in line with the other drum [D]. Both approx 600mm in height & possibly faceted (although erosion obscures this at this stage).







L3/1. Removed several large stones from the zone of limestone concentrated soil to the north of the trench.  
 Glass frag (3.1.2) found in this zone.  
 Some worked stone blocks featuring in this zone - smashed, scattered.  
 No suggestion of order.  
 Should be able to determine presence of foundation blocks once area beneath the large column drum is revealed.  
 Otherwise - things will probably remain chaotic until bedrock.  
 Nail (3.1.3) removed from brown earth just on border of limestone soil.  
 It appears that a level is appearing to the west of the spit, distinguished by clay like earth, which when removed, reveals a firm surface. It seems consistent to the level in adjacent B19 (in the bank) - not much of this stage if we have a good level surface (will know once "swiped" back & brushed).

Note: Much tile & 1st volume of pottery from this spit.

24/1 6am - Rain: A rather depressing morning with Coenne forced to leave. Much Joseph in the trenches. All seems so wrong to continue in Coenne's absence. But we know that he wishes for us to do so. And we hope we can produce some wonderful surprises for him.

11am - a few points of interest on which to comment:

- (1) the pair of column drums has soap flaking. Each appears to sit on disturbed earth below the level of the pavers to the west;
- (2) The "pavement" is situated upon a clay-like soil layer consisting of the lime apparent in the bank (earthen).
- (3) adjacent to the foundation blocks putting upon the earthen bank is a firm layer (floor like). This may well be a primary surface. Note that the blocks resting in the bank above this layer appear to indicate deliberate packing (too close to suggest robbing).

(4) The most disturbed area is evident in the north bank & the "square" zone of limy, sandy soil - very little lime from this area but several blocks & worked surfaces & "pick marks" suggestive of frontal robbing activity.

What we have within the bounds of this trench complex is the foundation for the cella walls including the remains of the rear wall, south wall & an interior wall of stylobate (note fragments of small column drums & the 2 column drums revealed early during excavations). Furthermore there is evidence that a stylobate continued down the south side of the cella between the south cella wall & the abut line. This made possible by the presence of a "retaining wall" & the structure that lies beneath. The

column base (+ power to the east of it). It appears likely that masonry would have been positioned against the retaining wall to form the load bearing structure required for the stylobate (see B9a). Waeme! - I think you have a pyramidal temple (see sketch).




