Report in brief: Baulk removal revealed a space 7.5 m E/W x 2.85 m N/S, with doorways in each wall, i.e.

West: blocked

South: not blocked but decayed and stones re-used for Feature D

North: blocked and re-modelled with western door jamb removed and replaced only with soil?

East: Narrow 80 cm doorway in existence in NE corner – may have replaced original wider door east when ovens were built.

Floors:

Depth of put?

Floor 1: associated with ovens and Feature D, possibly with Pit C. Note re-used masonry for feature D

Floor 2: 25-30 cm below, associated with pot stand Feature E, more or less in centre of space. Fill between floors contained tile and tumble

Floor 3? Uncertain as white line in narrow baulk in 7.4, 40 cm below floor 2, may be decayed stone rather than crushed limestone floor.

Floor 4? White line in narrow baulk 7.4, just above bedrock, may suggest occupation level but no pottery or bone between 7.3 and 7.4 **Suggested reconstruction:** 

The original form of this space, a relatively long and narrow area with doors opening in all directions, suggests a foyer-type function acting as an entry to big rooms to north, south and west, providing an important link between the two complexes/buildings, to north and south, each with their east-facing facades and courtyards. Its relationship to the room to the east must be explored next year by removal of the old baulk between 346/9 and 333/7. Confirmation of the doorway north is crucial but difficult to establish with certainty. However, see HJ drawing, which shows threshold stone and vertical door jamb. The centrally-placed pot stand in floor 2 may have some relevance to the entry-room function – washing ritual (pots often found beside doors suggest connection with liminality).

The ovens and feature D belong to tertiary occupation after some decay. I feel pretty sure the pit C belongs also to this phase, even though it went down below floor 2.

Floor 1: Features ON floor 1 are tertiary, i.e. adobe enclosure, jar deposits, possible decayed tannur in 11.2

Floor 2: only 10 cm below, level with top of stones abutting bedrock. Same floor, with Floor1 a resurfacing or build-up? This floor

belongs to doorway to north, with ashlar blocks either filling the dip in bedrock or serving as steps from lower floor.

Floor 3: Allegedly 20 cm lower (Levels must be incorrect for 7/5 = 1.92 m!!). Does this floor also serve the doorway north? Could do, with step

Floor 4: only 15 cm below. Same floor built up?

Floor 5: 5 cm below. Floors 4-5 surely one floor, resurfaced.

What happens below this? Needs clarification.

Suggest successive floors all belong to outdoor area, entry foyer to big rooms in T 5 and 10. Problem of entry to this foyer not solved – needs further excavation to south in 2011.

### **Comment:**

Baulk removal east essential to understanding of this room/courtyard: the small area to the east of Wall B was incorporated into the baulk removal 39/44. The room/courtyard excavated in T39 had 5 floors and at least 3 phases.

## Floors

Floor 1: below wall A was not found in excavation but clearly seen in the baulk, not a structured floor but a later uneven surface on which wall A was built – possibly a squatter-phase construction.

Floor 2: associated with base of ashy Features A and B, probably the later version of Floor 3, re-using fallen masonry so tertiary. Build-up of:

Floor 3: 25 cm below, associated with doorway east and also with doorway further east in T44, i.e. main entrance from east into Areas S proper. The floor covered both walls C and D and the base of wall B. Thickest and strongest floor.

Floor 4?: surface not found but should have been on top of lower walls C and D, 50 cm below floor 3? Perhaps not necessary – certainly not seen in baulk.

Floor 5 found in 9.1 @ 230 cm from surface, below top of walls C and D, and only 10 cm from bedrock. (cobble packing visible in baulk drawing).

#### Phases:

A: Occupation on floor near bedrock, associated with walls B, C and D.

B: walls C and D cut down to make larger space (courtyard?). Higher and thicker floor built, together with doorway in wall B east. B+ Re-occupation of floor, built up higher, re-using large masonry to protect ovens and features, so some decay between B/B+. Then Squatter-phase partial wall on later surface – perhaps to pen animals. NB wall on same oline in T33 probably only surface wall but was excavated lower.

**Pottery:** nearly 20 kg body sherds, mainly Jar. Fill L1 (between floors 3 and 4) contains ESA but none below floor 4. **Recommendations 2011** 

Take out southern and northern baulks, also western.

This baulk revealed the extent of the large doorway, surely an entry into the western part of Area S. Until N baulk is removed, we are not entirely sure of dimensions – but there is a wall in the northern baulk – is it at the level of floor 1 or 2? Entry room has two other doors – one centrally west in wall B of T39 and one south into the spoil heap! Is there also one north in 39? Some big blocks in intervening baulk. Note remarkable absence of lamp and fig frags (yet this is entry room?)

The baulk removal clarified that there were only 2 main floors = Floor 1 = floor 3 in 44 and floor 2 = floors 4-5 in 44. But remember that large threshold not on bedrock and in T39, structures were found below the level of the floor associated with the doorway east into this room (there floor 3). Compare levels! Yes; Floor 3 in 39 is 42.61, compared with 42.65 for floor 2 in 44 = same floor.

Comment: Locus 1 appears to be an outdoor area, with drain to catch water draining south down the hill from reaching the well-constructed E/W wall, which may therefore be a boundary wall? (yet in T 55, this area is also enclosed by the N/S wall extending uphill).

The deposit was typical of road fill, with many fragmentary objects. Both west baulk and north baulk sections showed a white line and ashy layer (floor) at approx level of 1.3, although this was not found in excavation. Only between this and the lower floor was any tumble evident and this was not extensive. Feature A was built on the lower floor – was it originally a full-width wall with the eastern face lost? Traces of adobe? So, later enclosure but it is quite high, as seen in the baulk (and see section) extending well above any upper floor. The upper floor puzzles me – too high for the drain? Just silted build-up?

Locus 2 not excavated further than defining the wall, as next-door trench 49 is dealing with the main part of this room.
