#### ADVICE to TRENCH SUPERVISORS

1. Take a **new page** for each day. (Each day may take several pages).
2. Draw a **scale plan** of the trench **each day** on the graph paper (essential), with North at the top (if this is not convenient, mark North direction clearly).  
When starting a square, this plan may be nearly empty but draw it all the same and mark in emerging tumble. The graph paper can also be used for sketching objects etc.
3. Mark **depth** from surface at the beginning of each day, at designated points. Also record, each day, the depths taken on the sheet provided (kept in the back of your field record book)
4. Draw arrows on your plan to indicate **direction** in which you are excavating.
4. Every time you designate a new context, (on the occasion of a new spit, a new feature, a new soil colour) fill in the **Context Record Sheet** for that trench, as well as describing it in your report. Store the accumulated context record sheets in the plastic sleeve in your record book.
5. **Structures** . Measure carefully any structure (wall, doorway, threshold, ovens, pit, any large dressed stones or columns) and record exact location, height, width in your report as well as on the scale plan.
6. **Floors** - marked by very hard tough surface or layer of white crushed limestone. May be softer adjacent to wall. Record thickness of floor, if we decide to dig through it.  
If your floor is particularly good, collect a few bags of surface material - there may be seeds.
7. **Objects**. e.g. glass, figurine or lamp fragments, metal, stucco, loomweights, spindle whorls, beads, graffito-ed sherds, coins, gold jewellery ( some hope). Mark in the location and depth of any objects clearly and accurately. If necessary, draw another sketch plan as the day progresses. A quick sketch of the object in the report would be helpful, if it is too mysterious to name e.g. Mattie's metal blobs.
8. **Pottery**: label bags clearly in waterproof pen, with one label inside the bag and one outside. **Record daily the number of bags per context** . Be very careful to separate pottery from different contexts.  
**It is absolutely essential to double-bag the pottery. A broken bag of pottery without context is useless.**
9. **Bone**: Collect all bone and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
10. **Charcoal**: Collect all charcoal and label as for pottery. Record number of bags per context daily.
11. **Tile**: it is important to record the location and amount of tile.
12. **Very important**: at the completion of a trench,
  - i DRAW ( TO SCALE) a section of the exposed baulk, with details of stratigraphy clearly marked.
  - ii DRAW ( TO SCALE) a top plan of the completed trench, with contexts clearly marked.
  - iii WRITE a short summary with your interpretation of the trench.

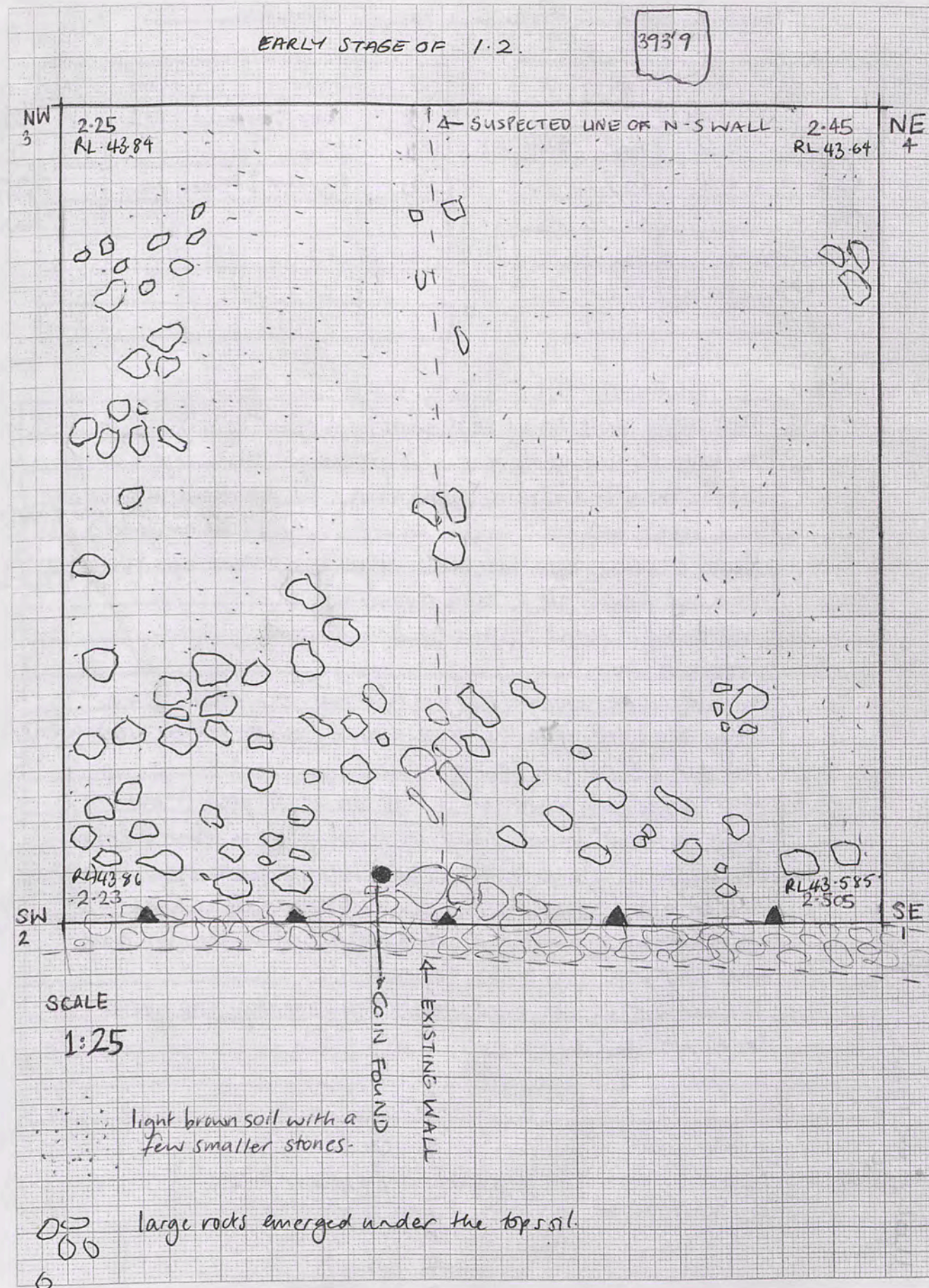

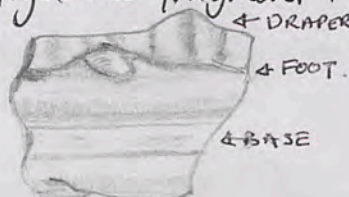

	- My team are continuing to dig from S → N. The large wall at the Southern end is more pronounced now. There is still a lot of stone, rocks and fill (?) in the western half. (wall not very good quality - not Greek.)
	- found a really nice fragment of a lamp that has an (partial) engraved image of a table amphora on it
	- Also found a wasp or other animal nest.
	- Found a coin !!
	- The workers are taking off layers by about 5cm from S-N
	- They are working on the eastern half first and then western half.
	- found a fragment of a figurine.
	- Wall emerging running S-N on an angle. It may have a right hand bend in it creating a new section
	- locus 2.1 - started bagging pottery from here separately.
	- The emerging wall doesn't seem very strong or substantial. We will have to wait and see the direction it runs in and what purpose it may have served.
	- The wall has not joined where I thought it may - no nuclear lines b/n L1 & L2.

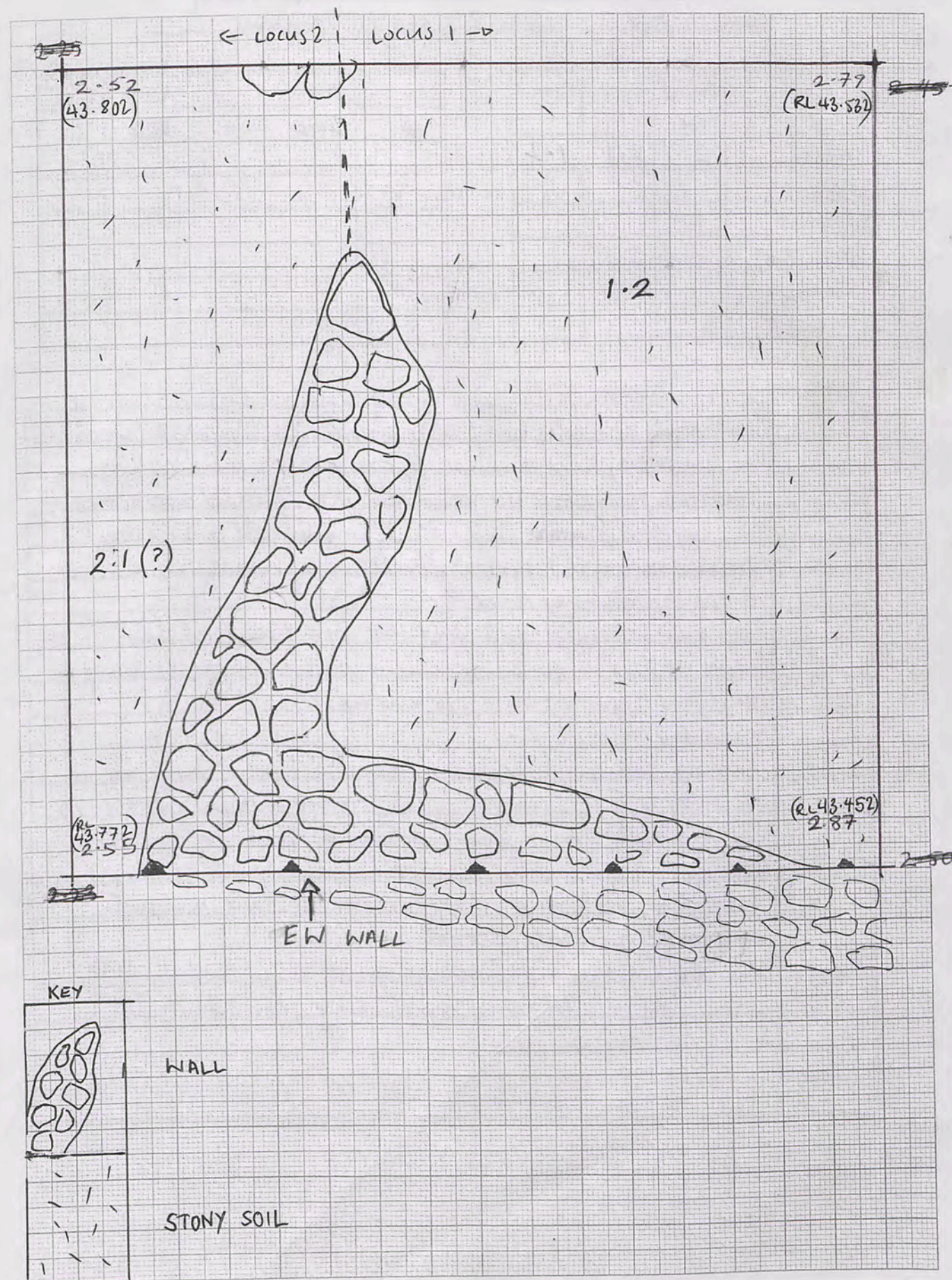

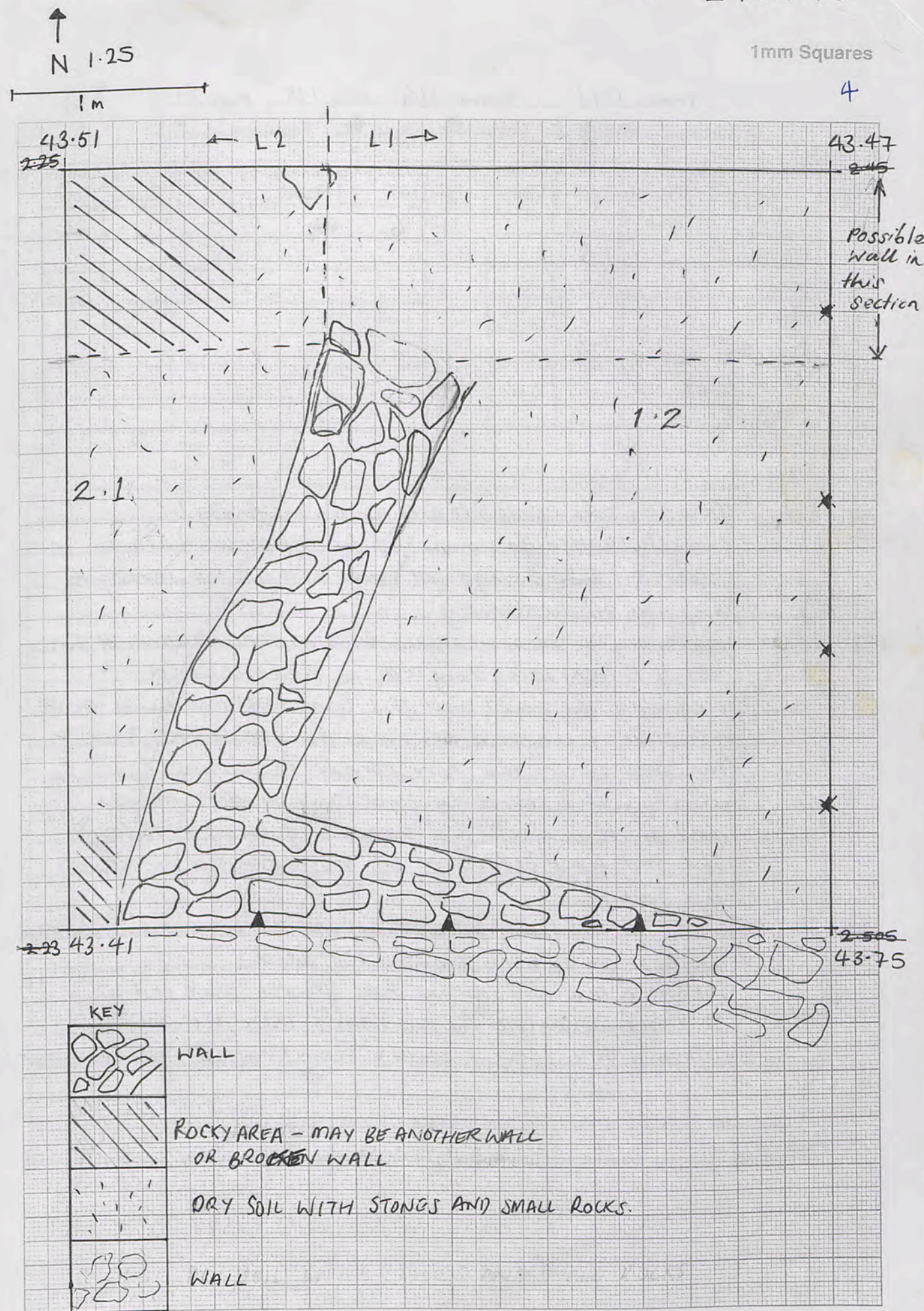

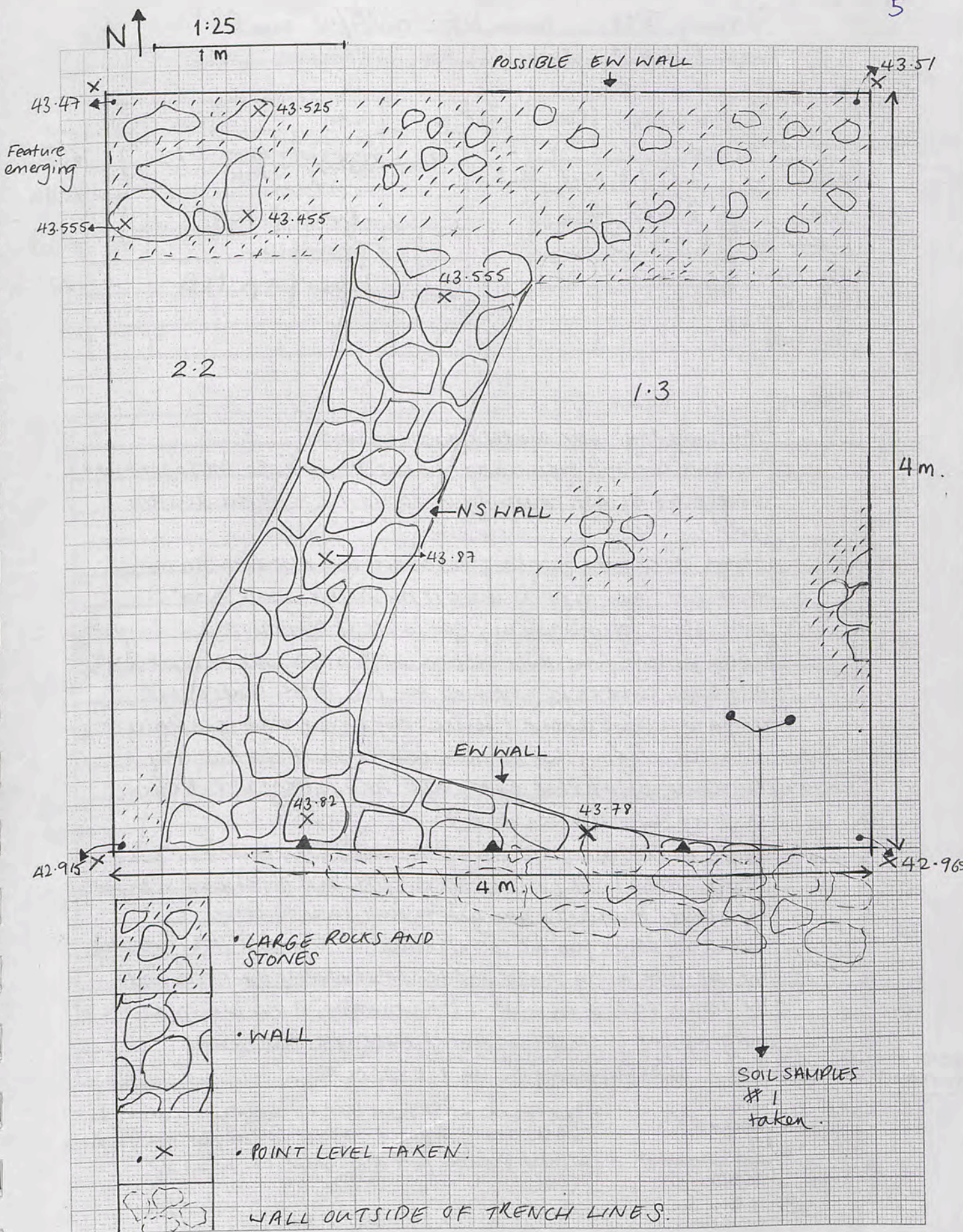

Not sure if another EW wall may appear? (The feature in the NW corner in Locus 2 is also quite interesting - not sure if this maybe part of a wall - Not excavating Locus 2 today.) The soil has become a bit more orange in colour in spit 3.

1-3	- Very rainy day - been sheltering in the caves. Workers are still excavating Locus 1. Spit 3. All looks wet!! - Quite a lot of Ash emerging in locus 1.3 - in the eastern end.
1.2-3	- I have asked the workers to remove the northern section that has been left as there is no visible wall and it will start to mix up my spit levels if left too much longer. - Any pottery from this section will be a mix of spit 2 & 3. - Also some large rocks emerging in 1.3 in the centre. Will dig and clean around these - not sure if may be a feature
1.2-3 (wall feature)	- Started digging the northern end to see if there is any evidence of another EW wall. Any pottery will be from a mix of 1.2 and 1.3. - So far no evidence of a wall. The rocks in the middle of 1.3 maybe sitting on a floor (judging by the level of the floor in surrounding trenches. Hopefully can get to this later today). - Took a soil sample from NE corner under a large rock. (Pottery also). - The wall is becoming smaller and less substantial at the north end. - The possible second EW wall is still uncertain. A few big rocks are emerging but it is still unclear if these are from a wall.
	- Found Megarian moulded ware in the NE corner.

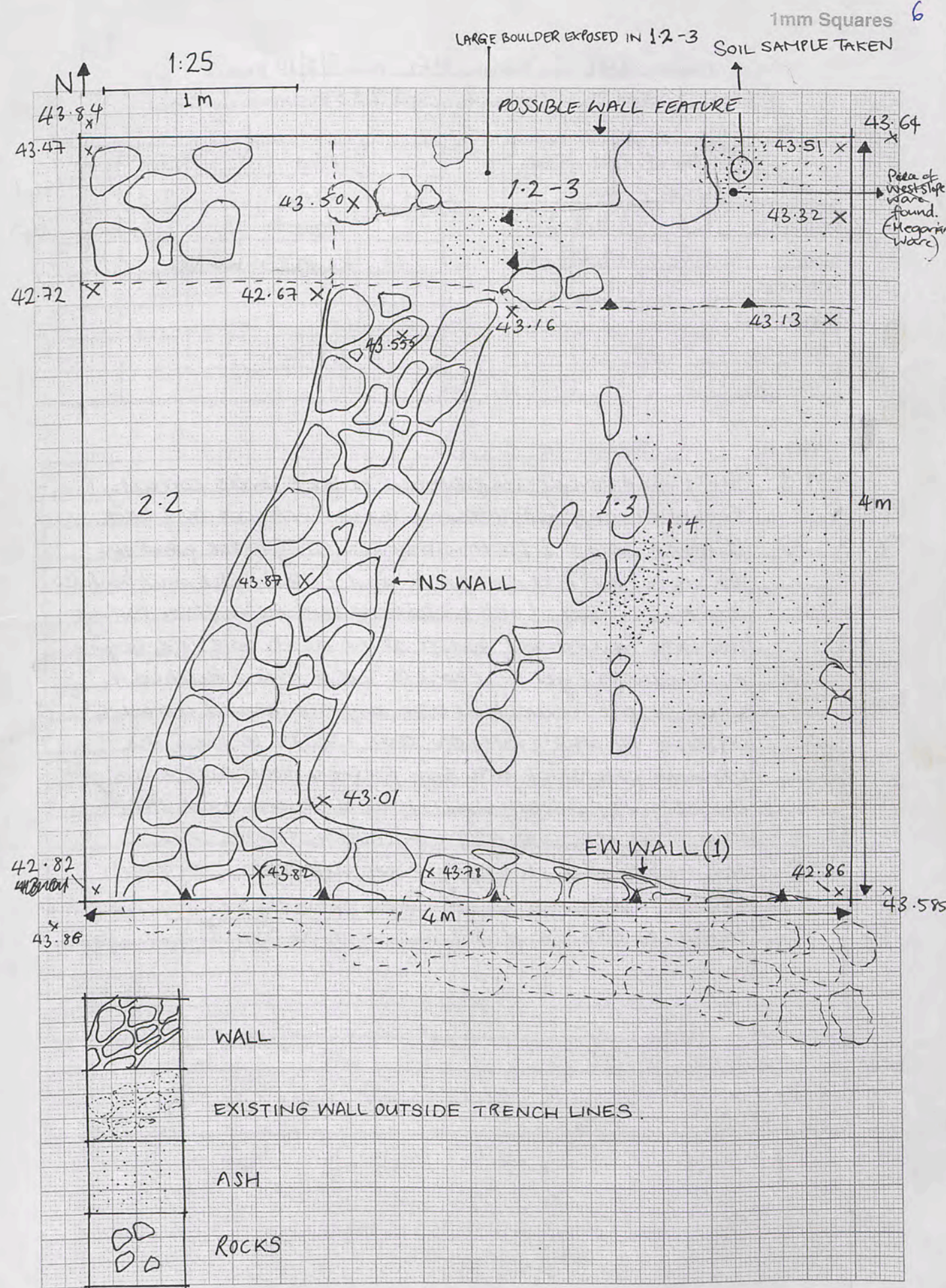

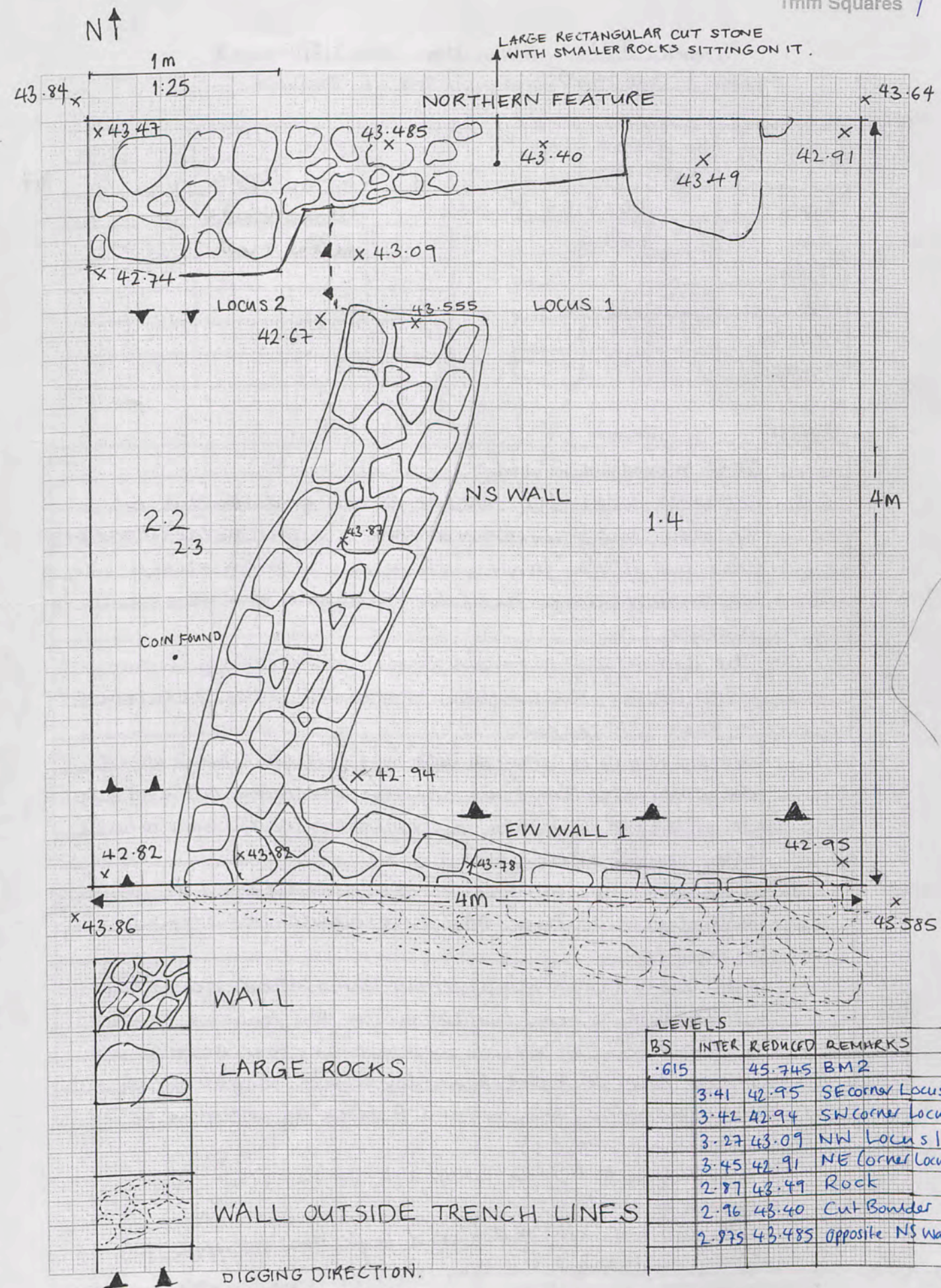
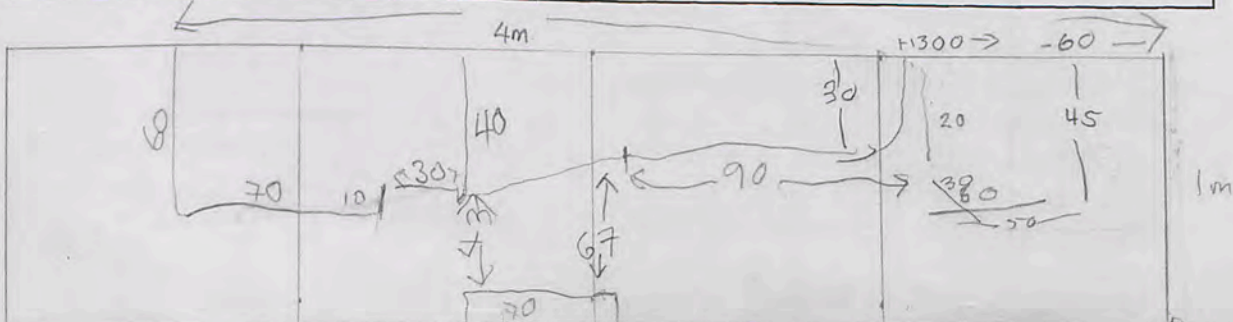

1.4	Really windy today - very difficult to take levels correctly! Finished clearing out 1.4 and the workers are now back
2.2	digging locus 2.2 - it will be interesting to see what the feature in the NW corner is and if the rocks and boulders become a wall. I will be looking out for a floor today. The large boulder and feature at the north end is emerging more clearly - yet it is hard to tell if it is a deliberate wall or not. It seems this area may have housed nomadic people or something later on. This would explain the random patches of ash from fires, the bones and possibly the slightly shoddy walls!! All to be confirmed still. Found more bone and also some broken tile in 2.2 soil under 2.2 looking a bit different in areas so will change to 2.3 - (a bit more ashy)

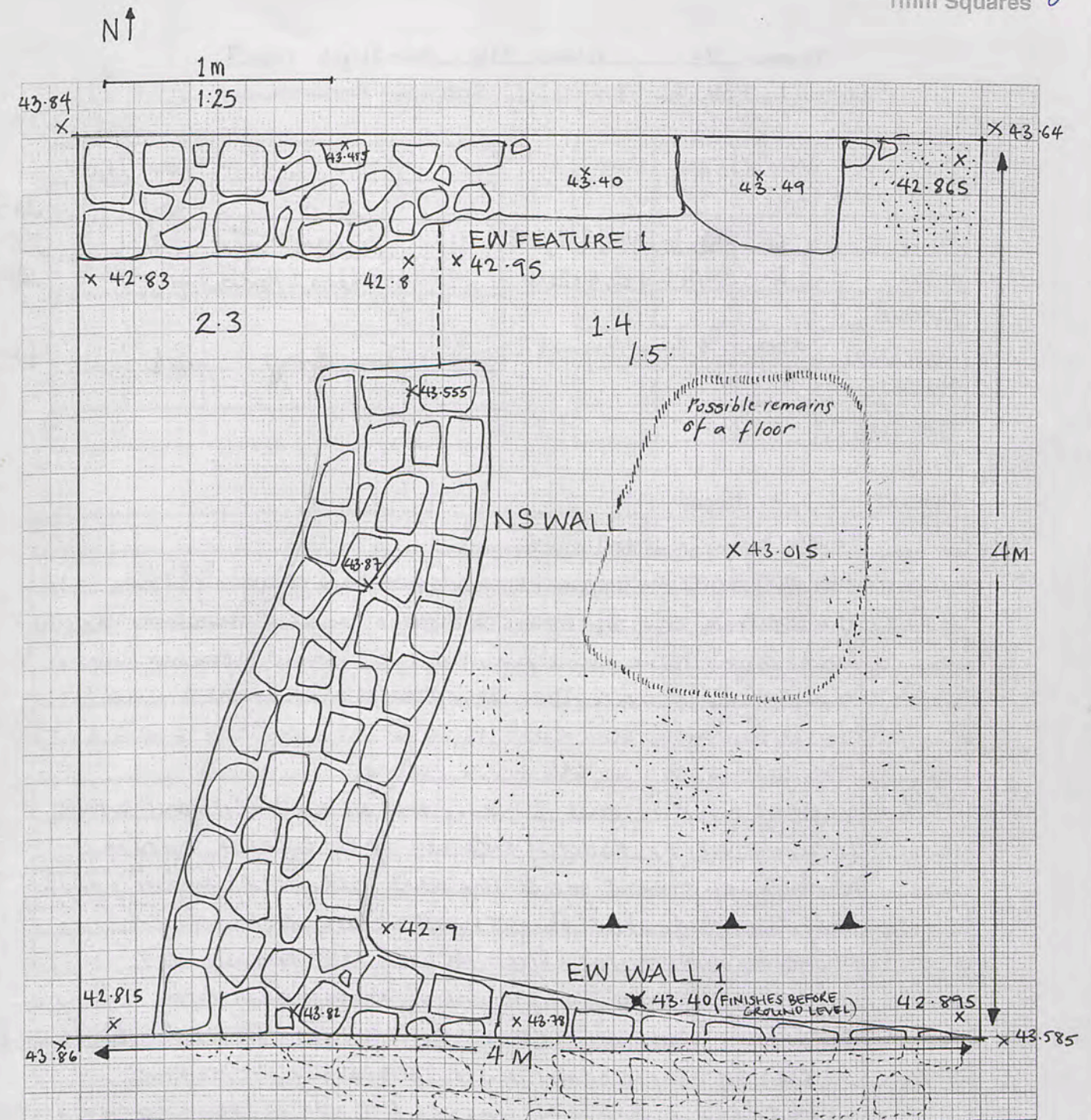

Bright morning with no wind  
 1.4 Digging in Locus 1.4 - lots of pottery and quite a bit of bone being uncovered. (And a piece of metal) (SE end #1.4)  
 - The soil is very stoney with a mix of small rubble-like rocks and larger rocks. Not sure when the floor will appear.  
 - The soil in the northern end is more orange in colour than that in the southern part. Still some ashy remnant in the NE corner.  
 - THE EW wall (1) is sitting on <sup>soil and rubble</sup> ~~the floor~~ now - We must have missed the floor. Interestingly the southern end of the NS wall goes down deeper but then the northern end seems to have been built later.  
 - Some floor has emerged in the middle of 1.4 - I'll take levels of this and also where the EW wall appears to sit.  
 - It does seem to show a mix of periods. Each wall has clearly been worked on by a later civilisation. The EW feature 1 is also a puzzle. It is not a built up wall - rather a series of placed rocks and cut boulders - again maybe by a later civilisation who wished to block an entrance or divide a room?

1.5 - moved down to 1.5 - a lot of ash in the floor level exposed in 1.4  
 - 1.5 also has a lot of ash and large bone fragments.  
 - Digging down in the NW corner of locus 1 - ~~possibly evidence of another wall?~~  
 Possibly evidence of another wall? - will see tomorrow.

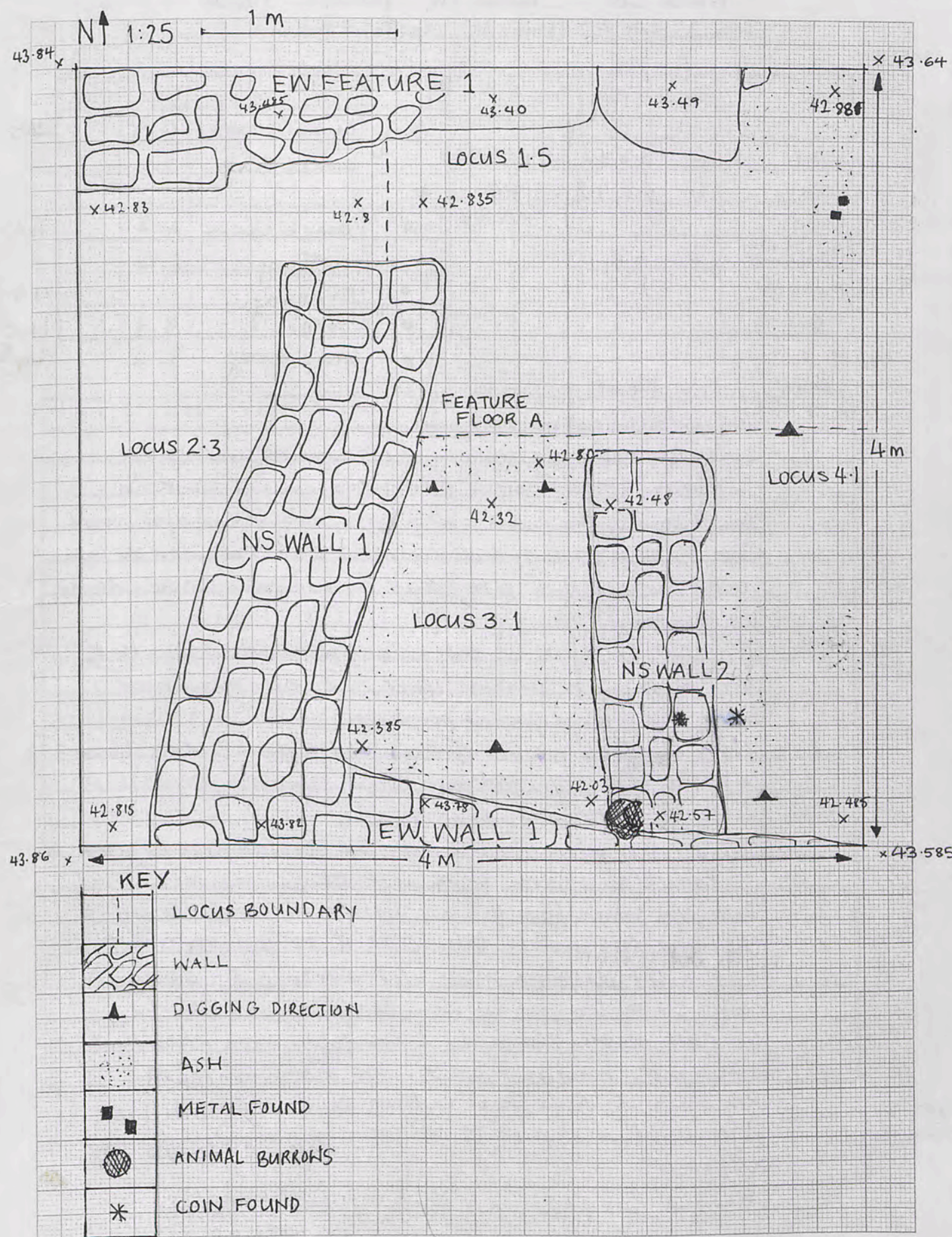

	lovely bright and still morning.
1.5	After discovering the section of floor we are now digging down into the southern end of Locus 1 I have divided this into another locus as we have found another NS running feature which may become a wall. This SW corner is now Locus 3 and the digging to the east is so far still part of Locus 1 (5). The soil in 3.1 is still quite ashy.
4.1	Decided to split Locus 1 where the NS Wall 2 is and create Locus 4 on the Easterly side. will take Locus 4 upto the Northern end and meet the EW feature 1 (break through floor feature 1 to have straight line). Found a coin next to NS Wall 2 in 4.1. Also found some metal object. in the NE end of 4.1. It is possible with the amount of Pottery and bone coming out that I am in the courtyard area. The new NS Wall (2) is clearly much older and probably primary (EW 1, NS 1 and EW feature 1 - all be secondary + tertiary). Soil on top of the 'feature floor A' is quite orange in colour and does not have any of the white parts usually found in a floor. Below this there is an ashy layer.
	I am having difficulty defining Locus 4. It now extended over part of 'Feature Floor A'.

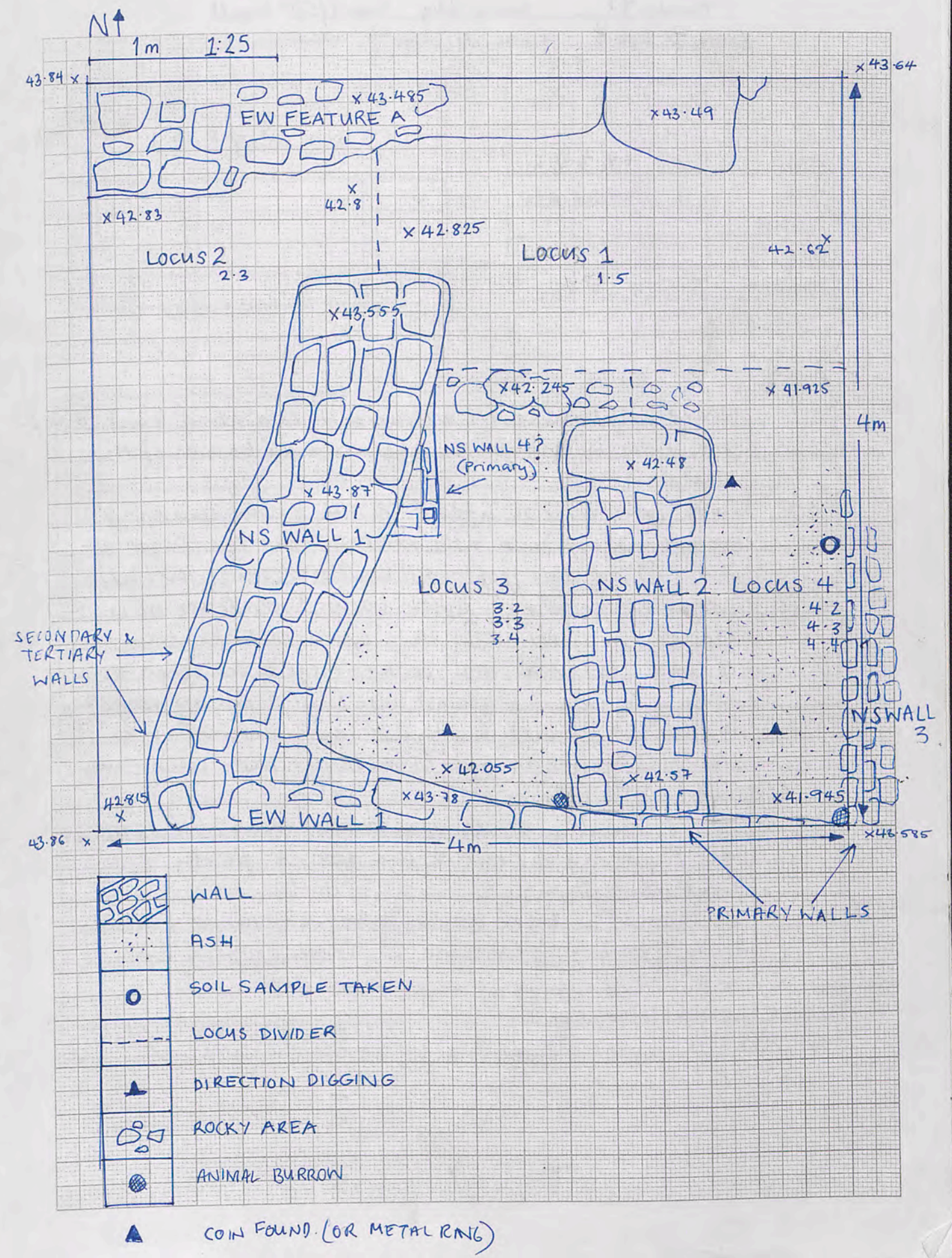

	Very still and clear morning.
	We are still excavating down in the southern end of the trench in Locus 3 + 4 - either side of NS Wall 2. Looking for the bottom of the wall - and hence the floor &/or level.
	There is also a possibility that due to the ash areas and the boxes and huge amount of pottery that T41 has been used as a dump at some stage.
4.2	The soil in 4.2 is slightly darker than 3.2 - they are both at a similar level - so they may have been used for different purposes.
3.2	There appears to be a line of rocks at the north end of Locus 3.2 - not sure if this is just from a random collapse or if it will turn into a feature.
	Slightly more pottery from 4.2 than 3.2 but the same amount of bone! (And same types of Pottery)
	Took soil sample from 4.2 as soil quite dark + ashy.
	Changed spit levels in both L3 + 4 as soil starting to look a bit different in both. (4 - darker, 3 - orangey)
	Locus 3 + 4 are getting very deep now but the SE part of the eastern boundary has revealed some more very old wall. - we now have to dig down to find the bottom of this!

Spits 3+4 may merge together.

Will leave a step in each locus as access getting difficult.  
 - Changed spit again as going down so fast!!  
 - Clearly now have another NS Wall (3) at the same level as NS Wall 2 - will take the levels tomorrow (Locus 4)

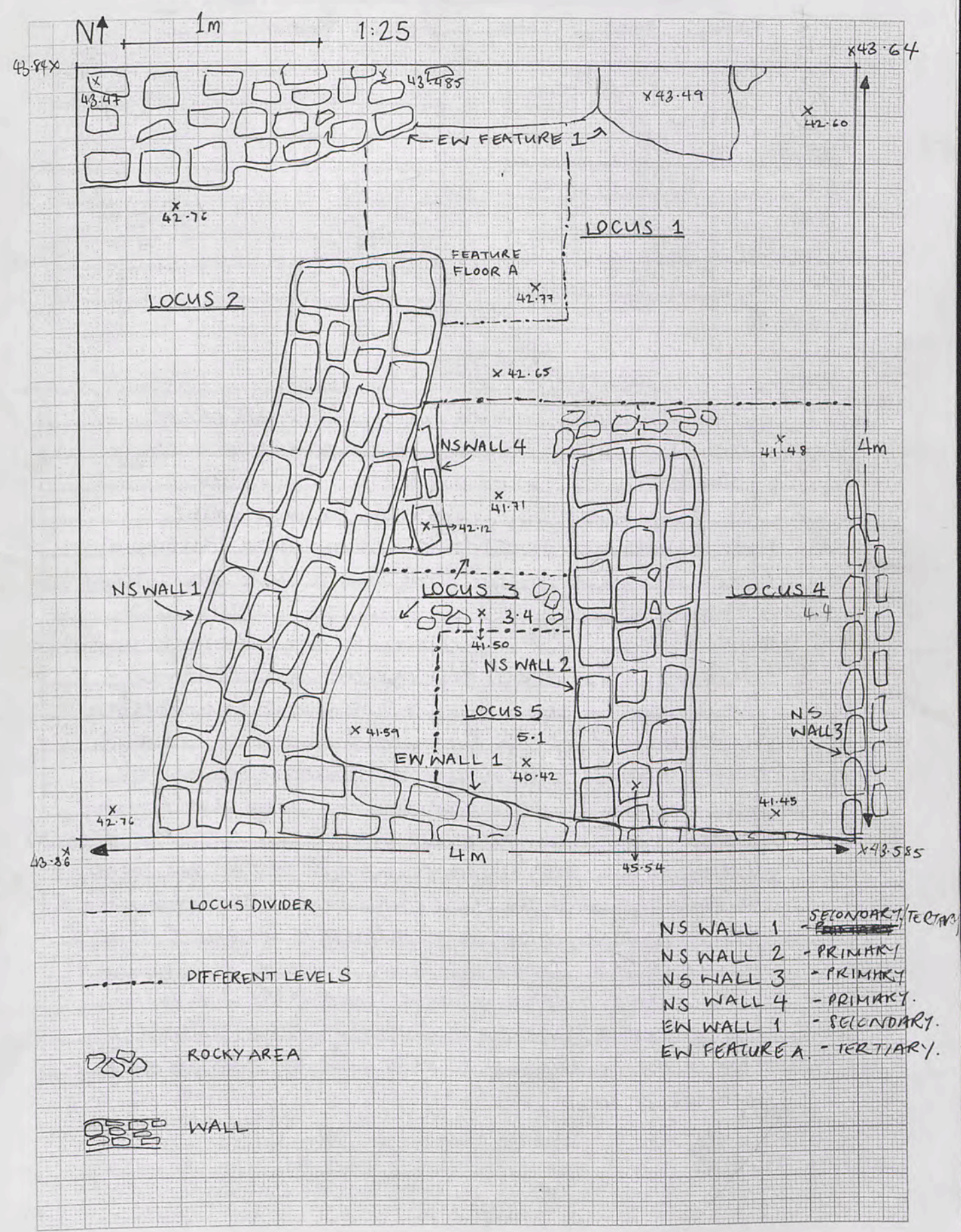

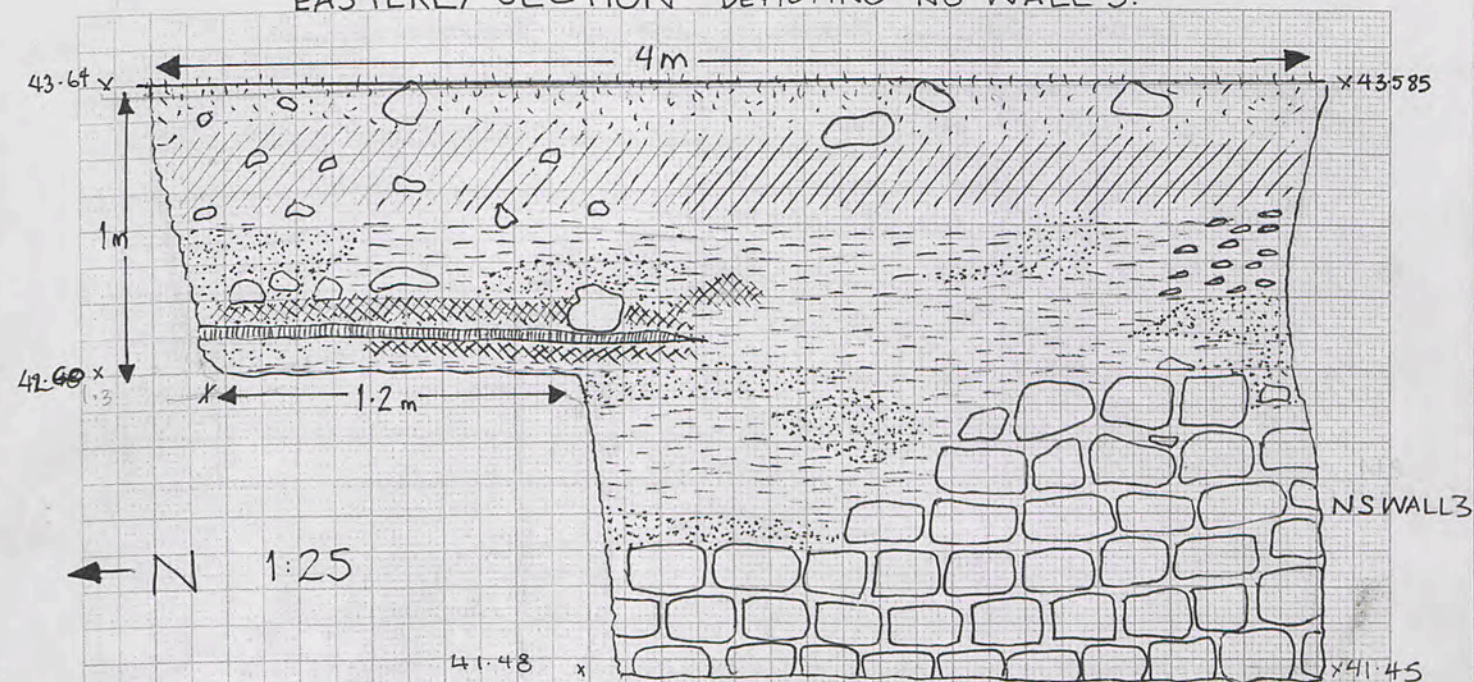

	Digging has now finished. I will draw up section drawings of the southerly, northerly and easterly walls.
	It is very interesting to see how (see wall (NS) 1,) Secondary and Tertiary walls have been combined, and are all above some much older and deeper Primary walls.
	The northerly end of NS wall 2 has some large boulders (ashlar shaped blocks) that indicate that they may have been a doorway. We have not excavated opposite this so not too sure if this is the case.
	There appears to be about 3 different levels of occupation in this trench. The very old Primary walls (NS wall 2, NS wall 3 and part of NS wall 4) went down 3.5 m. There was Pottery in all levels of this, down to the bed rock - indicating people had been present, and using the site down to the level of the Jebel.
	The narrow space formed by NS wall 2 + NS wall 3 is interesting, without having any other context to place this within, it is difficult to determine the purpose of this space.

This section shows where we found the side of another Primary Wall (NS wall 3). This wall has not been excavated to Jebel, but it is likely that it goes down about 3.5 m - like the Primary wall alongside it (NS wall 2). This section also shows another floor level a bit lower than Feature Floor A. (shown on main diagram). This floor is visible as it sits between layers of compacted limestone, with ash above it. It is also just above the Primary walls and so would have been a much later occupation. If this is the case it explains why it is not more defined and was dug through. Above this is a lot of windblown soil and rubble.

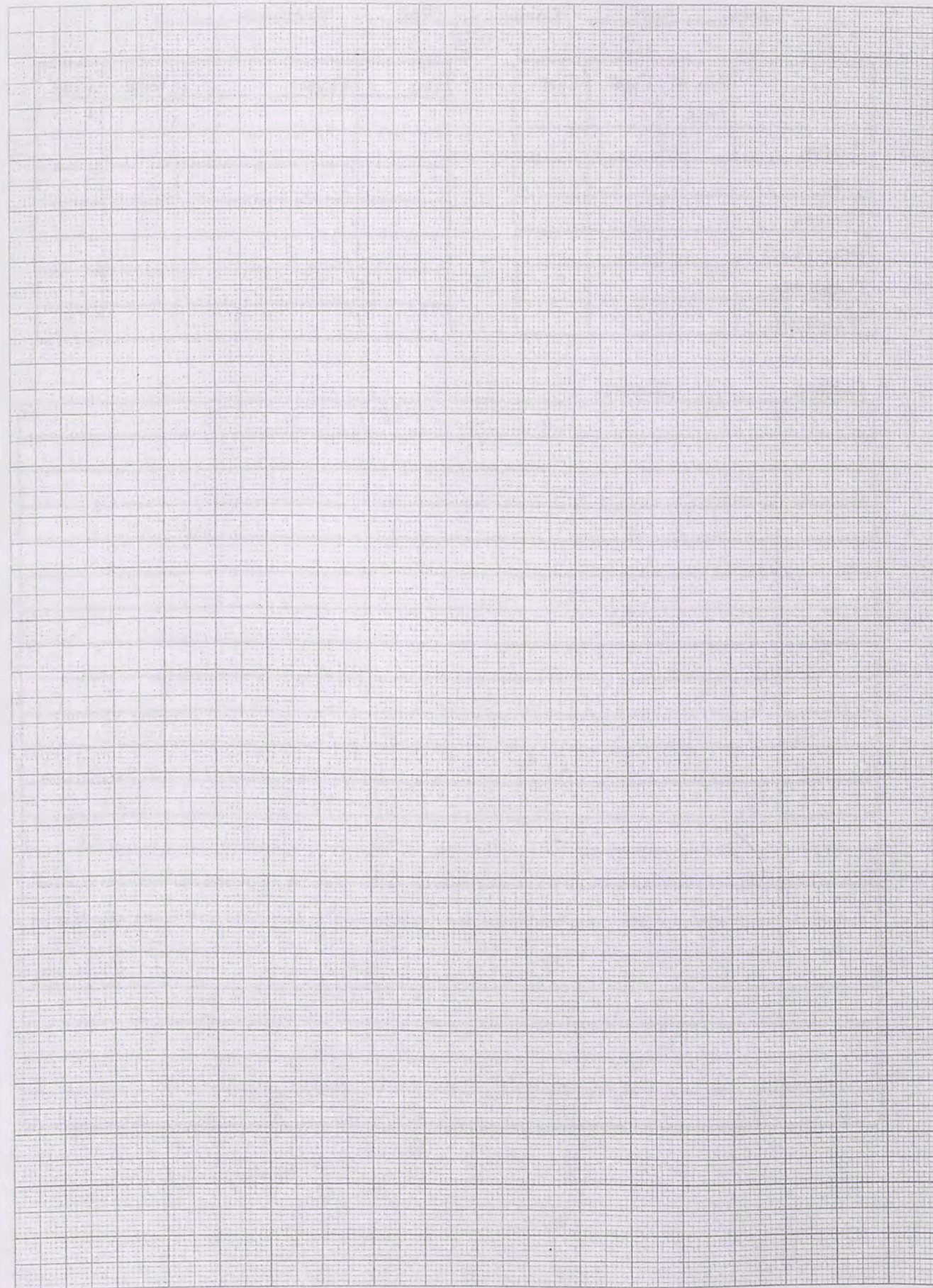

T41 is an interesting trench with at least 3 different occupation levels (but no defined floors of substance). The trench has Primary, Secondary and tertiary additions. The presence of ash (outside of ovens), indicates that the site may have been used by nomadic people at a later stage. This is backed up by the later additions of areas being blocked up (EW Feature A) and the northerly end of NS Wall 1, which is not straight and sits on soil. It is also possible that this area has been used as a dump as there was a huge amount of Pottery + bone found. Interestingly the type of Pottery, from the top layer to the Jebel (3.5m ↓) all stayed similar. There were mainly Jars and Jugs found, without much fineware, tableware, cookware or Pithos or amphora. It is also interesting to consider that the level of the Primary walls may be below the Courtyard to the west.

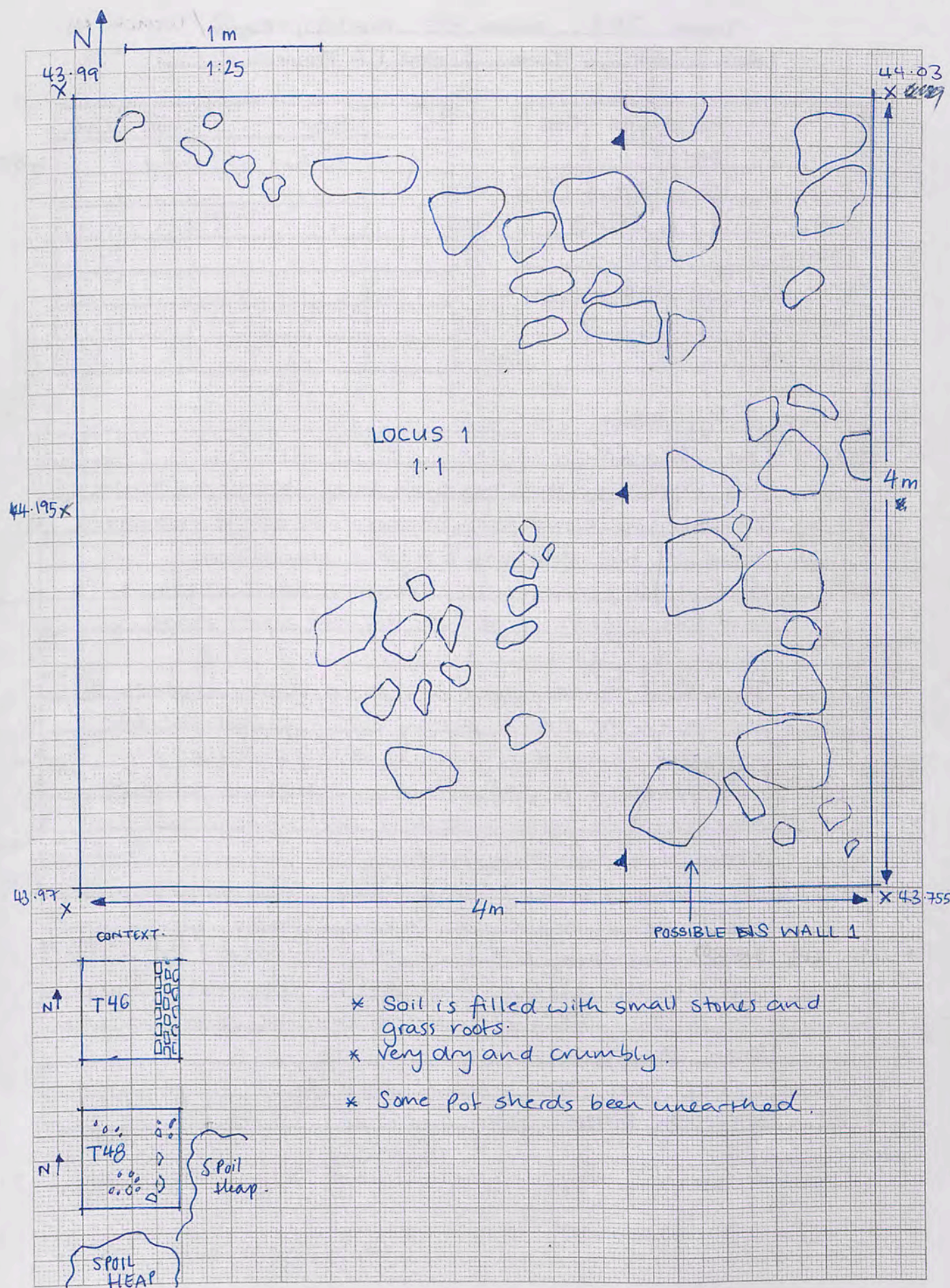

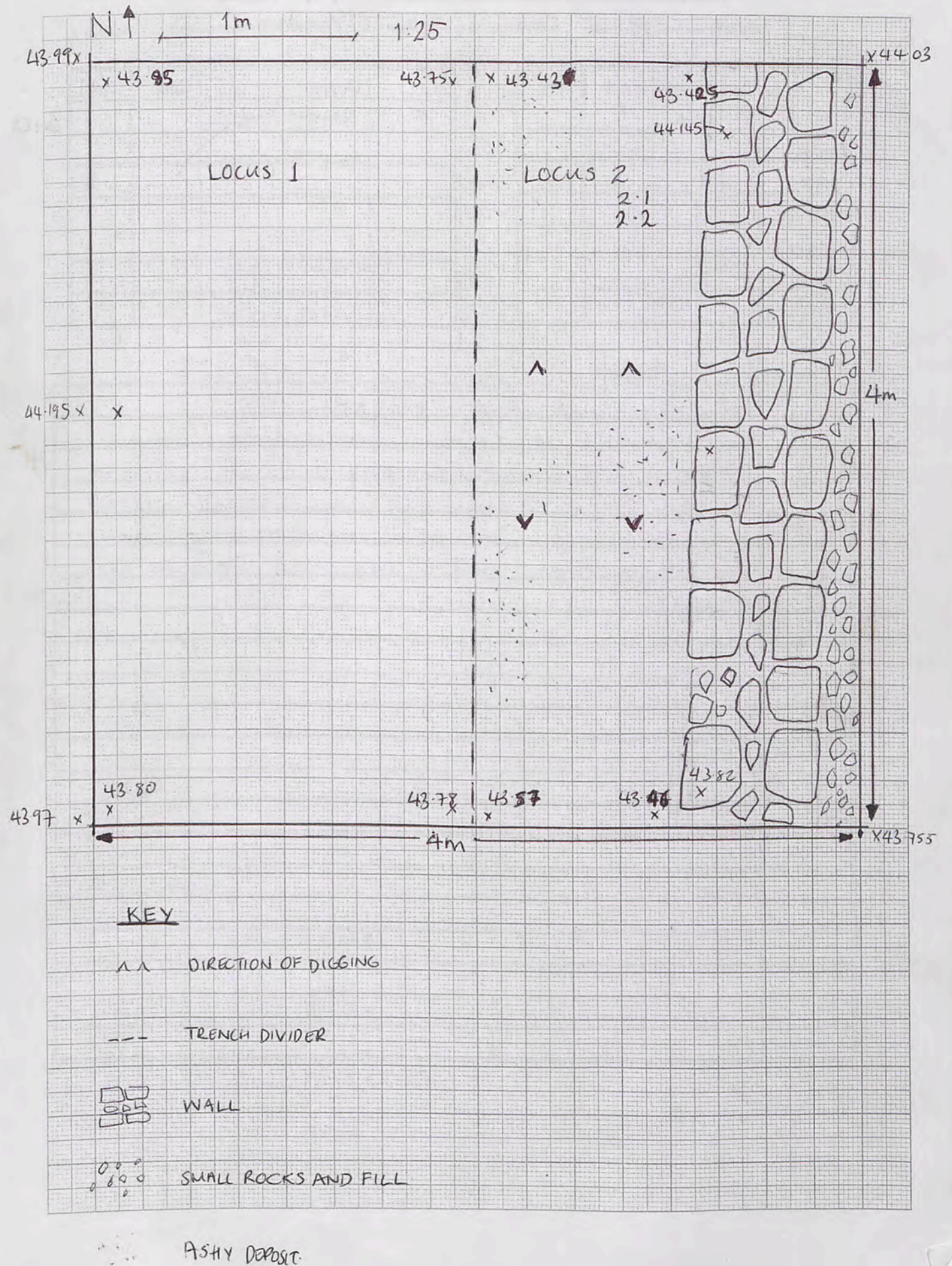

1.1	Hazy morning. We have cut the trench in half to just go down next to the road. We will try and do this quickly and so we can move to the other area. So far the wall looks like it continues from N-S but excavation is still uncovering the southern end so will have to wait. The soil is pottery and has some damp sections in it. There is not much pottery coming out at the moment - what there is looks mucky and like fill.
2.1	I will change to spit 2 as it is starting to get a bit darker - Actually have kept it spit 1 locus 2 as trench has been divided. Pottery from 1.1 is all of the top soil. 2.1 is still just fill, but is about 30-40cm down. - There is no gate, just wall next to road. No objects not much pottery.  - The floor level in Locus 1 is not (I believe) a real floor. I think the floor is actually a bit lower. Similarly in Locus 3, the floor may have been a bit higher, as the threshold in the doorway is not sitting on anything substantial. There are probably a few levels of occupation, and none of them appear to have a very well prepared floor. The doorway is lovely and strong and has great features with the corner niche, the doorpost holes and chiseled out doorjams on each post. It is still unclear as what this room/area has been used for. The amount of objects and Pottery from Locus 4 was significantly higher than any other area and matched with the finds from T45.

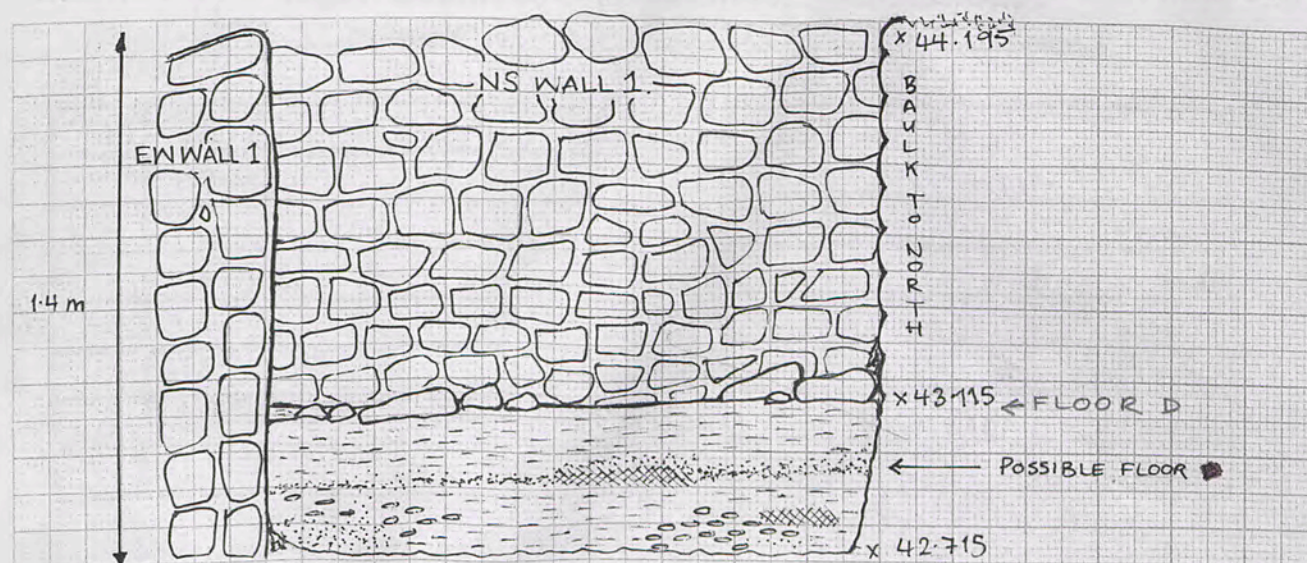

- T50 has the substantial wall running in an EW direction, with a large double doorway. This wall must be contemporary with the NS wall of the road, as the stones are keyed in together where they join.
- The doorway is large, with porches outside the room and a niche cut through one stone pillar. There are also shaped doorjams and a groove where the two doors could be locked.
- The floor levels are not well defined and floor 'A' and 'D' are most likely not true floors.
- The northern half was clearly the occupied area, as locus 4.1 yielded a great deal of pottery and objects.

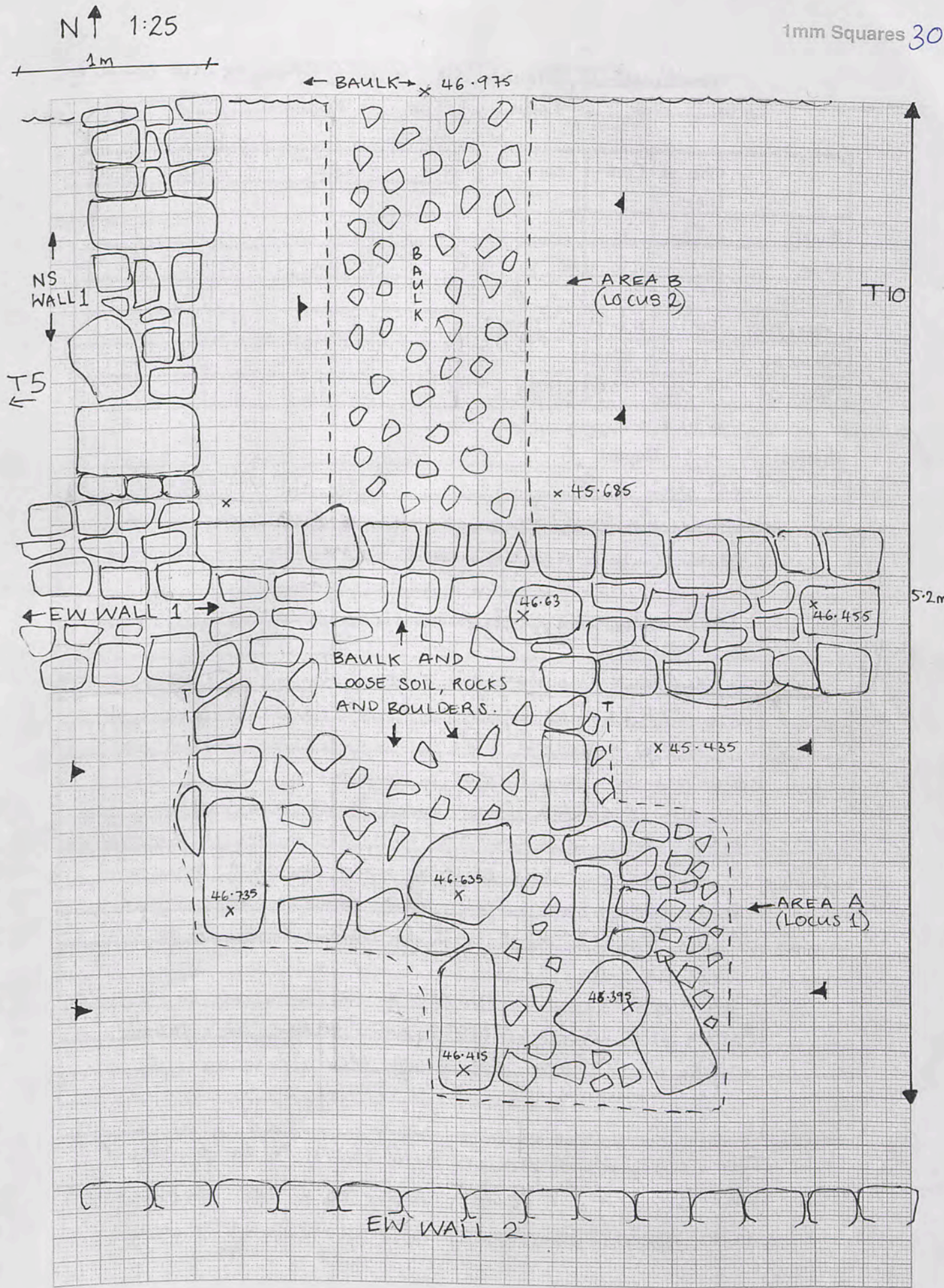

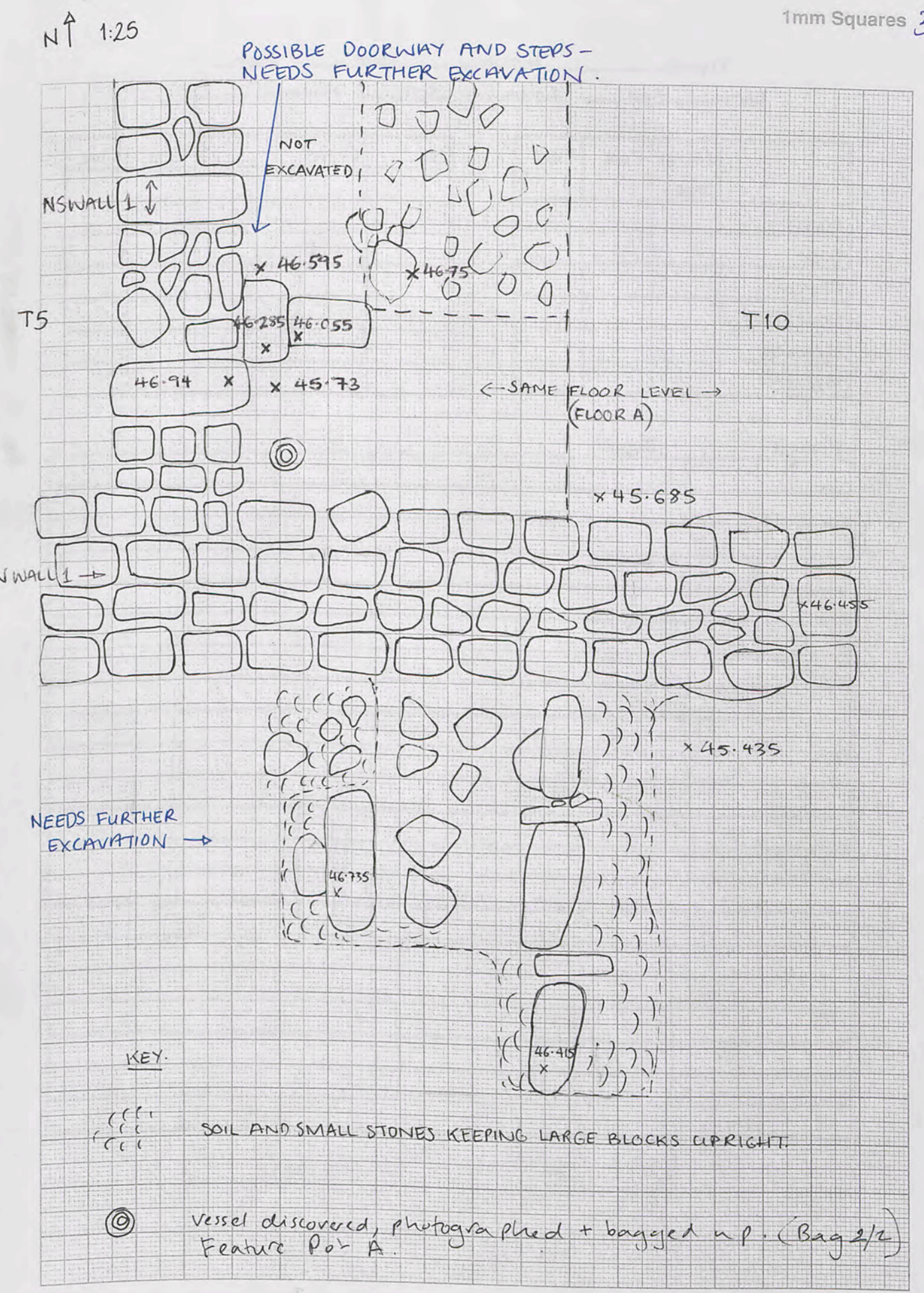
